## SENATE BILL 5088

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time January 18, 1991. Referred to Committee on Governmental Operations.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to public disclosure of gifts to public officials;
- 2 and amending RCW 42.17.020 and 42.17.241.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 42.17.020 and 1990 c 139 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) "Agency" includes all state agencies and all local agencies.
- 7 "State agency" includes every state office, department, division,
- 8 bureau, board, commission, or other state agency. "Local agency"
- 9 includes every county, city, town, municipal corporation, quasi-
- 10 municipal corporation, or special purpose district, or any office,
- 11 department, division, bureau, board, commission, or agency thereof, or
- 12 other local public agency.
- 13 (2) "Ballot proposition" means any "measure" as defined by RCW
- 14 29.01.110, or any initiative, recall, or referendum proposition
- 15 proposed to be submitted to the voters of the state or any municipal

- 1 corporation, political subdivision, or other voting constituency from
- 2 and after the time when the proposition has been initially filed with
- 3 the appropriate election officer of that constituency prior to its
- 4 circulation for signatures.
- 5 (3) "Depository" means a bank designated by a candidate or
- 6 political committee pursuant to RCW 42.17.050.
- 7 (4) "Treasurer" and "deputy treasurer" mean the individuals
- 8 appointed by a candidate or political committee, pursuant to RCW
- 9 42.17.050, to perform the duties specified in that section.
- 10 (5) "Candidate" means any individual who seeks election to public
- 11 office. An individual shall be deemed to seek election when he or she
- 12 first:
- 13 (a) Receives contributions or makes expenditures or reserves space
- 14 or facilities with intent to promote his or her candidacy for office;
- 15 or
- (b) Announces publicly or files for office.
- 17 (6) "Commercial advertiser" means any person who sells the service
- 18 of communicating messages or producing printed material for broadcast
- 19 or distribution to the general public or segments of the general public
- 20 whether through the use of newspapers, magazines, television and radio
- 21 stations, billboard companies, direct mail advertising companies,
- 22 printing companies, or otherwise.
- 23 (7) "Commission" means the agency established under RCW 42.17.350.
- 24 (8) "Compensation" unless the context requires a narrower meaning,
- 25 includes payment in any form for real or personal property or services
- 26 of any kind: PROVIDED, That for the purpose of compliance with RCW
- 27 42.17.241, the term "compensation" shall not include per diem
- 28 allowances or other payments made by a governmental entity to reimburse
- 29 a public official for expenses incurred while the official is engaged
- 30 in the official business of the governmental entity.

- 1 (9) "Continuing political committee" means a political committee
- 2 that is an organization of continuing existence not established in
- 3 anticipation of any particular election campaign.
- 4 (10) "Contribution" includes a loan, gift, deposit, subscription,
- 5 forgiveness of indebtedness, donation, advance, pledge, payment,
- 6 transfer of funds between political committees, or transfer of anything
- 7 of value, including personal and professional services for less than
- 8 full consideration, but does not include interest on moneys deposited
- 9 in a political committee's account, ordinary home hospitality and the
- 10 rendering of personal services of the sort commonly performed by
- 11 volunteer campaign workers, or incidental expenses personally incurred
- 12 by volunteer campaign workers not in excess of fifty dollars personally
- 13 paid for by the worker. Volunteer services, for the purposes of this
- 14 chapter, means services or labor for which the individual is not
- 15 compensated by any person. For the purposes of this chapter,
- 16 contributions other than money or its equivalents shall be deemed to
- 17 have a money value equivalent to the fair market value of the
- 18 contribution. Sums paid for tickets to fund-raising events such as
- 19 dinners and parties are contributions; however, the amount of any such
- 20 contribution may be reduced for the purpose of complying with the
- 21 reporting requirements of this chapter, by the actual cost of
- 22 consumables furnished in connection with the purchase of the tickets,
- 23 and only the excess over the actual cost of the consumables shall be
- 24 deemed a contribution.
- 25 (11) "Elected official" means any person elected at a general or
- 26 special election to any public office, and any person appointed to fill
- 27 a vacancy in any such office.
- 28 (12) "Election" includes any primary, general, or special election
- 29 for public office and any election in which a ballot proposition is
- 30 submitted to the voters: PROVIDED, That an election in which the

- 1 qualifications for voting include other than those requirements set
- 2 forth in Article VI, section 1 (Amendment 63) of the Constitution of
- 3 the state of Washington shall not be considered an election for
- 4 purposes of this chapter.
- 5 (13) "Election campaign" means any campaign in support of or in
- 6 opposition to a candidate for election to public office and any
- 7 campaign in support of, or in opposition to, a ballot proposition.
- 8 (14) "Expenditure" includes a payment, contribution, subscription,
- 9 distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of
- 10 value, and includes a contract, promise, or agreement, whether or not
- 11 legally enforceable, to make an expenditure. The term "expenditure"
- 12 also includes a promise to pay, a payment, or a transfer of anything of
- 13 value in exchange for goods, services, property, facilities, or
- 14 anything of value for the purpose of assisting, benefiting, or honoring
- 15 any public official or candidate, or assisting in furthering or
- 16 opposing any election campaign. For the purposes of this chapter,
- 17 agreements to make expenditures, contracts, and promises to pay may be
- 18 reported as estimated obligations until actual payment is made. The
- 19 term "expenditure" shall not include the partial or complete repayment
- 20 by a candidate or political committee of the principal of a loan, the
- 21 receipt of which loan has been properly reported.
- 22 (15) "Final report" means the report described as a final report in
- 23 RCW 42.17.080(2).
- 24 (16) "Gift" means a rendering of money, property, services,
- 25 <u>discount</u>, <u>loan forgiveness</u>, <u>payment of indebtedness</u>, <u>reimbursements</u>
- 26 from or payments by persons, other than the state of Washington or any
- 27 agency or political subdivision thereof, for travel or anything else of
- 28 <u>value in excess of ten dollars in return for which legal consideration</u>
- 29 of equal or greater value is not given and received but does not
- 30 <u>include:</u>

- 1 (a) Any contribution that is required to be reported under RCW
- 2 42.17.090 or 42.17.243;
- 3 (b) Any informational material that is transferred for the purpose
- 4 of informing the recipient about matters pertaining to official agency
- 5 business, and that is not intended to financially benefit that
- 6 recipient;
- 7 (c) Any symbolic presentation that is not intended to financially
- 8 benefit the recipient;
- 9 (d) Any honorarium that is required to be reported under this
- 10 <u>chapter;</u>
- 11 (e) Any hosting in the form of entertainment, meals, or
- 12 refreshments, the value of which does not exceed one hundred dollars,
- 13 furnished in connection with official appearances, official ceremonies,
- 14 and occasions where official agency business is discussed;
- 15 (f) Gifts that are not used and that, within thirty days after
- 16 receipt, are returned to the donor or delivered to a charitable
- 17 organization without being claimed as a charitable contribution for tax
- 18 purposes;
- 19 (g) Intrafamily gifts; or
- 20 (h) Gifts received in the normal course of private business or
- 21 social interaction that are not related to public policy decisions or
- 22 agency actions.
- 23 (17) "Immediate family" includes the spouse, dependent children,
- 24 and other dependent relatives, if living in the household.
- 25 (((17))) (18) "Legislation" means bills, resolutions, motions,
- 26 amendments, nominations, and other matters pending or proposed in
- 27 either house of the state legislature, and includes any other matter
- 28 that may be the subject of action by either house or any committee of
- 29 the legislature and all bills and resolutions that, having passed both
- 30 houses, are pending approval by the governor.

- 1  $((\frac{18}{18}))$  "Lobby" and "lobbying" each mean attempting to
- 2 influence the passage or defeat of any legislation by the legislature
- 3 of the state of Washington, or the adoption or rejection of any rule,
- 4 standard, rate, or other legislative enactment of any state agency
- 5 under the state Administrative Procedure Act, chapter 34.05 RCW.
- 6 Neither "lobby" nor "lobbying" includes an association's or other
- 7 organization's act of communicating with the members of that
- 8 association or organization.
- 9  $((\frac{19}{19}))$  (20) "Lobbyist" includes any person who lobbies either in
- 10 his <u>or her</u> own or another's behalf.
- 11  $((\frac{20}{10}))$  (21) "Lobbyist's employer" means the person or persons by
- 12 whom a lobbyist is employed and all persons by whom he or she is
- 13 compensated for acting as a lobbyist.
- $((\frac{(21)}{21}))$  (22) "Person" includes an individual, partnership, joint
- 15 venture, public or private corporation, association, federal, state, or
- 16 local governmental entity or agency however constituted, candidate,
- 17 committee, political committee, political party, executive committee
- 18 thereof, or any other organization or group of persons, however
- 19 organized.
- 20  $((\frac{(22)}{2}))$  "Person in interest" means the person who is the
- 21 subject of a record or any representative designated by that person,
- 22 except that if that person is under a legal disability, the term
- 23 "person in interest" means and includes the parent or duly appointed
- 24 legal representative.
- $((\frac{(23)}{(24)}))$  "Political advertising" includes any advertising
- 26 displays, newspaper ads, billboards, signs, brochures, articles,
- 27 tabloids, flyers, letters, radio or television presentations, or other
- 28 means of mass communication, used for the purpose of appealing,
- 29 directly or indirectly, for votes or for financial or other support in
- 30 any election campaign.

- 1 (((24))) "Political committee" means any person (except a
- 2 candidate or an individual dealing with his or her own funds or
- 3 property) having the expectation of receiving contributions or making
- 4 expenditures in support of, or opposition to, any candidate or any
- 5 ballot proposition.
- 6 (((25))) (26) "Public office" means any federal, state, county,
- 7 city, town, school district, port district, special district, or other
- 8 state political subdivision elective office.
- 9  $((\frac{(26)}{)})$  "Public record" includes any writing containing
- 10 information relating to the conduct of government or the performance of
- 11 any governmental or proprietary function prepared, owned, used, or
- 12 retained by any state or local agency regardless of physical form or
- 13 characteristics.
- (((27))) (28) "Surplus funds" mean, in the case of a political
- 15 committee or candidate, the balance of contributions that remain in the
- 16 possession or control of that committee or candidate subsequent to the
- 17 election for which the contributions were received, and that are in
- 18 excess of the amount necessary to pay remaining debts incurred by the
- 19 committee or candidate prior to that election. In the case of a
- 20 continuing political committee, "surplus funds" mean those
- 21 contributions remaining in the possession or control of the committee
- 22 that are in excess of the amount necessary to pay all remaining debts
- 23 when it makes its final report under RCW 42.17.065.
- (((28))) (29) "Writing" means handwriting, typewriting, printing,
- 25 photostating, photographing, and every other means of recording any
- 26 form of communication or representation, including letters, words,
- 27 pictures, sounds, or symbols, or combination thereof, and all papers,
- 28 maps, magnetic or paper tapes, photographic films and prints, magnetic
- 29 or punched cards, discs, drums, and other documents.

- 1 As used in this chapter, the singular shall take the plural and any
- 2 gender, the other, as the context requires.
- 3 Sec. 2. RCW 42.17.241 and 1984 c 34 s 3 are each amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 (1) The statement of financial affairs required by RCW 42.17.240
- 6 shall disclose for the reporting individual and each member of his or
- 7 <u>her</u> immediate family:
- 8 (a) Occupation, name of employer, and business address; and
- 9 (b) Each bank or savings account or insurance policy in which any
- 10 such person or persons owned a direct financial interest that exceeded
- 11 five thousand dollars at any time during the reporting period; each
- 12 other item of intangible personal property in which any such person or
- 13 persons owned a direct financial interest, the value of which exceeded
- 14 five hundred dollars during the reporting period; the name, address,
- 15 and nature of the entity; and the nature and highest value of each such
- 16 direct financial interest during the reporting period; and
- 17 (c) The name and address of each creditor to whom the value of five
- 18 hundred dollars or more was owed; the original amount of each debt to
- 19 each such creditor; the amount of each debt owed to each creditor as of
- 20 the date of filing; the terms of repayment of each such debt; and the
- 21 security given, if any, for each such debt: PROVIDED, That debts
- 22 arising out of a "retail installment transaction" as defined in chapter
- 23 63.14 RCW (Retail Installment Sales Act) need not be reported; and
- 24 (d) Every public or private office, directorship, and position held
- 25 as trustee; and
- 26 (e) All persons for whom any legislation, rule, rate, or standard
- 27 has been prepared, promoted, or opposed for current or deferred
- 28 compensation: PROVIDED, That for the purposes of this subsection,
- 29 "compensation" does not include payments made to the person reporting

- 1 by the governmental entity for which such person serves as an elected
- 2 official or state executive officer or professional staff member for
- 3 his or her service in office; the description of such actual or
- 4 proposed legislation, rules, rates, or standards; and the amount of
- 5 current or deferred compensation paid or promised to be paid; and
- 6 (f) The name and address of each governmental entity, corporation,
- 7 partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, association, union, or
- 8 other business or commercial entity from whom compensation has been
- 9 received in any form of a total value of five hundred dollars or more;
- 10 the value of the compensation; and the consideration given or performed
- 11 in exchange for the compensation; and
- 12 (g) The name of any corporation, partnership, joint venture,
- 13 association, union, or other entity in which is held any office,
- 14 directorship, or any general partnership interest, or an ownership
- 15 interest of ten percent or more; the name or title of that office,
- 16 directorship, or partnership; the nature of ownership interest; and
- 17 with respect to each such entity: (i) With respect to a governmental
- 18 unit in which the official seeks or holds any office or position, if
- 19 the entity has received compensation in any form during the preceding
- 20 twelve months from the governmental unit, the value of the compensation
- 21 and the consideration given or performed in exchange for the
- 22 compensation; (ii) the name of each governmental unit, corporation,
- 23 partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, association, union, or
- 24 other business or commercial entity from which the entity has received
- 25 compensation in any form in the amount of two thousand five hundred
- 26 dollars or more during the preceding twelve months and the
- 27 consideration given or performed in exchange for the compensation:
- 28 PROVIDED, That the term "compensation" for purposes of this subsection
- 29 (1)(g)(ii) does not include payment for water and other utility
- 30 services at rates approved by the Washington state utilities and

- 1 transportation commission or the legislative authority of the public
- 2 entity providing the service: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That with respect to
- 3 any bank or commercial lending institution in which is held any office,
- 4 directorship, partnership interest, or ownership interest, it shall
- 5 only be necessary to report either the name, address, and occupation of
- 6 every director and officer of the bank or commercial lending
- 7 institution and the average monthly balance of each account held during
- 8 the preceding twelve months by the bank or commercial lending
- 9 institution from the governmental entity for which the individual is an
- 10 official or candidate or professional staff member, or all interest
- 11 paid by a borrower on loans from and all interest paid to a depositor
- 12 by the bank or commercial lending institution if the interest exceeds
- 13 six hundred dollars; and
- 14 (h) A list, including legal or other sufficient descriptions as
- 15 prescribed by the commission, of all real property in the state of
- 16 Washington, the assessed valuation of which exceeds two thousand five
- 17 hundred dollars in which any direct financial interest was acquired
- 18 during the preceding calendar year, and a statement of the amount and
- 19 nature of the financial interest and of the consideration given in
- 20 exchange for that interest; and
- 21 (i) A list, including legal or other sufficient descriptions as
- 22 prescribed by the commission, of all real property in the state of
- 23 Washington, the assessed valuation of which exceeds two thousand five
- 24 hundred dollars in which any direct financial interest was divested
- 25 during the preceding calendar year, and a statement of the amount and
- 26 nature of the consideration received in exchange for that interest, and
- 27 the name and address of the person furnishing the consideration; and
- 28 (j) A list, including legal or other sufficient descriptions as
- 29 prescribed by the commission, of all real property in the state of
- 30 Washington, the assessed valuation of which exceeds two thousand five

- 1 hundred dollars in which a direct financial interest was held:
- 2 PROVIDED, That if a description of the property has been included in a
- 3 report previously filed, the property may be listed, for purposes of
- 4 this provision, by reference to the previously filed report; and
- 5 (k) A list, including legal or other sufficient descriptions as
- 6 prescribed by the commission, of all real property in the state of
- 7 Washington, the assessed valuation of which exceeds five thousand
- 8 dollars, in which a corporation, partnership, firm, enterprise, or
- 9 other entity had a direct financial interest, in which corporation,
- 10 partnership, firm, or enterprise a ten percent or greater ownership
- 11 interest was held; and
- 12 (1) The name and address of each person who has made one or more
- 13 gifts, together with a description of each gift including its monetary
- 14 value, the date of the gift, and the aggregate value of all gifts
- 15 received from each person during the reporting period; and
- 16 (m) Such other information as the commission may deem necessary in
- 17 order to properly carry out the purposes and policies of this chapter,
- 18 as the commission shall prescribe by rule.
- 19 (2) Where an amount is required to be reported under subsection
- 20 (1)((, paragraphs)) (a) through (k) of this section, it shall be
- 21 sufficient to comply with the requirement to report whether the amount
- 22 is less than one thousand dollars, at least one thousand dollars but
- 23 less than five thousand dollars, at least five thousand dollars but
- 24 less than ten thousand dollars, at least ten thousand dollars but less
- 25 than twenty-five thousand dollars, or twenty-five thousand dollars or
- 26 more. An amount of stock may be reported by number of shares instead
- 27 of by market value. No provision of this subsection may be interpreted
- 28 to prevent any person from filing more information or more detailed
- 29 information than required.
