- 1 AN ACT Relating to prohibiting firearms near judicial proceedings;
- 2 and amending RCW 9.41.300.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 9.41.300 and 1985 c 428 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) It is unlawful for any person to enter the following places
- 7 when he or she knowingly possesses or knowingly has under his or her
- 8 control a firearm:
- 9 (a) The restricted access areas of a jail, or of a law enforcement
- 10 facility, or any place used for the confinement of a person (i)
- 11 arrested for, charged with, or convicted of an offense, (ii) charged
- 12 with being or adjudicated to be a juvenile offender as defined in RCW
- 13 13.40.020, (iii) held for extradition or as a material witness, or (iv)
- 14 otherwise confined pursuant to an order of a court, except an order

- 1 under chapter 13.32A or 13.34 RCW. Restricted access areas do not
- 2 include common areas of egress or ingress open to the general public;
- 3 (b) A ((courtroom or judge's chamber, while either is being used
- 4 for any judicial proceeding. This does not include common areas of
- 5 egress and ingress of the courthouse)) building used regularly for the
- 6 conduct of judicial proceedings, or, in other buildings, a room while
- 7 being used for the conduct of judicial proceedings;
- 8 (c) The restricted access areas of a public mental health facility
- 9 certified by the department of social and health services for inpatient
- 10 hospital care and state institutions for the care of the mentally ill,
- 11 excluding those facilities solely for evaluation and treatment.
- 12 Restricted access areas do not include common areas of egress and
- 13 ingress open to the general public; or
- 14 (d) That portion of an establishment classified by the state liquor
- 15 control board as off-limits to persons under twenty-one years of age.
- 16 (2) Notwithstanding RCW 9.41.290, cities, towns, counties, and
- 17 other municipalities may enact laws and ordinances:
- 18 (a) Restricting the discharge of firearms in any portion of their
- 19 respective jurisdictions where there is a reasonable likelihood that
- 20 humans, domestic animals, or property will be jeopardized. Such laws
- 21 and ordinances shall not abridge the right of the individual guaranteed
- 22 by Article I, section 24 of the state Constitution to bear arms in
- 23 defense of self or others; and
- 24 (b) Restricting the possession of firearms in any stadium or
- 25 convention center, operated by a city, town, county, or other
- 26 municipality, except that such restrictions shall not apply to:
- (i) Any firearm in the possession of a person licensed under RCW
- 28 9.41.070; or
- 29 (ii) Any showing, demonstration, or lecture involving the
- 30 exhibition of firearms.

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- 1 (3) The perimeter of the premises of any specific location covered
- 2 by subsection (1) of this section shall be posted at reasonable
- 3 intervals to alert the public as to the existence of any law
- 4 restricting the possession of firearms on the premises.
- 5 (4) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to:
- 6 (a) A person engaged in military activities sponsored by the
- 7 federal or state governments, while engaged in official duties;
- 8 (b) Law enforcement personnel; or
- 9 (c) Security personnel while engaged in official duties.
- 10 (5) Subsection (1)(a) of this section does not apply to a person
- 11 licensed pursuant to RCW 9.41.070 who, upon entering the place or
- 12 facility, directly and promptly proceeds to the administrator of the
- 13 facility or the administrator's designee and obtains written permission
- 14 to possess the firearm while on the premises or checks his or her
- 15 firearm. The person may reclaim the firearms upon leaving but must
- 16 immediately and directly depart from the place or facility.
- 17 (6) Subsection (1)(b) of this section does not apply to a judge or
- 18 court employee or to any person licensed under RCW 9.41.070 who((-
- 19 before entering the restricted area, directly and promptly proceeds to
- 20 the court administrator or the administrator's designee and obtains))
- 21 has obtained written permission to possess the firearm, in a building
- 22 <u>designated in subsection (1)(b) of this section, from the court</u>
- 23 <u>administrator or the administrator's designee</u>.
- 24 (7) Subsection (1)(c) of this section does not apply to any
- 25 administrator or employee of the facility or to any person who, upon
- 26 entering the place or facility, directly and promptly proceeds to the
- 27 administrator of the facility or the administrator's designee and
- 28 obtains written permission to possess the firearm while on the
- 29 premises.

- 1 (8) Subsection (1)(d) of this section does not apply to the
- 2 proprietor of the premises or his or her employees while engaged in
- 3 their employment.
- 4 (9) Any person violating subsection (1) of this section is guilty
- 5 of a misdemeanor.
