- 1 AN ACT Relating to driving privileges of high school students;
- 2 amending RCW 46.20.091; and adding a new section to chapter 46.20 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.20 RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The department shall deny or revoke the instruction permit or
- 7 driver's license of any person who is under eighteen years of age and
- 8 who is required to attend school under RCW 28A.225.010 if that person
- 9 has ten consecutive or fifteen days' total unexcused absences from high
- 10 school during one semester or the equivalent of one semester, including
- 11 absences due to suspension or expulsion.
- 12 (2) The high school principal or other appropriate school official
- 13 shall notify the department about any student over the age of fifteen
- 14 who has ten consecutive or fifteen days' total unexcused absences from

- 1 high school during one semester or the equivalent of one semester,
- 2 including absences due to suspension or expulsion.
- 3 (3) The department of licensing and the office of the
- 4 superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to implement
- 5 this section.
- 6 (4) This section shall not apply to a person who is under eighteen
- 7 years of age whose parent or guardian submits a statement in writing to
- 8 the department of licensing stating that it is their belief that their
- 9 child is receiving or has received an adequate education through the
- 10 provisions of chapter 28A.225 RCW and their child should continue to
- 11 hold a driver's license or instruction permit. The letter submitted
- 12 under this subsection shall be used only for the purposes of this
- 13 subsection.
- 14 Sec. 2. RCW 46.20.091 and 1990 c 250 s 35 are each amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 (1) Every application for an instruction permit or for an original
- 17 driver's license shall be made upon a form prescribed and furnished by
- 18 the department which shall be sworn to and signed by the applicant
- 19 before a person authorized to administer oaths. Every application for
- 20 an instruction permit containing a photograph shall be accompanied by
- 21 a fee of five dollars. The department shall forthwith transmit the
- 22 fees collected for instruction permits and temporary drivers' permits
- 23 to the state treasurer.
- 24 (2) Every such application shall state the full name, date of
- 25 birth, sex, and Washington residence address of the applicant, and
- 26 briefly describe the applicant, and shall state whether the applicant
- 27 has theretofore been licensed as a driver or chauffeur, and, if so,
- 28 when and by what state or country, and whether any such license has
- 29 ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever been

- 1 refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such suspension,
- 2 revocation, or refusal, and shall state such additional information as
- 3 the department shall require. For persons under the age of eighteen,
- 4 the department shall require proof of high school attendance if such
- 5 attendance is required under RCW 28A.225.010 on a form provided by the
- 6 school, a high school diploma or other document showing proof of
- 7 graduation from high school, or letter from a parent or quardian as
- 8 required under section 1 of this 1991 act.
- 9 (3) Whenever application is received from a person previously
- 10 licensed in another jurisdiction, the department shall request a copy
- 11 of such driver's record from such other jurisdiction. When received,
- 12 the driving record shall become a part of the driver's record in this
- 13 state.
- 14 (4) Whenever the department receives request for a driving record
- 15 from another licensing jurisdiction, the record shall be forwarded
- 16 without charge if the other licensing jurisdiction extends the same
- 17 privilege to the state of Washington. Otherwise there shall be a
- 18 reasonable charge for transmittal of the record, the amount to be fixed
- 19 by the director of the department.
