State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to aquatic animal health; adding a new chapter to
- 2 Title 15 RCW; and making appropriations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature has recognized that
- 5 aquaculture is a branch of the agriculture industry; farmed fish and
- 6 shellfish are among the top fifteen agricultural commodities in
- 7 Washington state with an annual production value of forty-two million
- 8 dollars; there is an increased demand world-wide for fish and fish
- 9 products; and Washington state aquatic animal producers play a
- 10 significant role in the world market for aquacultural products and in
- 11 the economy of the state.
- 12 The legislature further recognizes that confined public and private
- 13 farmed fish and shellfish are substantially vulnerable and sensitive to
- 14 the risk of diseases. To ensure the highest levels of production, for
- 15 both the public and private sectors, identification and treatment of

- 1 these diseases is imperative. There are insufficient diagnostic,
- 2 certification, and extension services available to Washington's aquatic
- 3 animal industry; and there is no complete training program provided at
- 4 any Washington state institution of higher education to educate
- 5 professionals in the areas of aquatic animal health, diagnostics, and
- 6 certification.
- 7 Therefore, the legislature finds that it is in the best interest of
- 8 the state to develop aquatic animal diagnostic and extension services
- 9 and curricula within the state, and to provide state veterinarian
- 10 certification for aquatic animal products, as is currently done for the
- 11 livestock industry. It is the intent of the legislature that in
- 12 consultation with the aquaculture industry, Washington State
- 13 University, the University of Washington, and the department of
- 14 agriculture cooperate in the development of such services and
- 15 curricula.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The department of agriculture shall
- 17 contract with Washington State University to establish and operate an
- 18 aquatic animal health diagnostic and extension laboratory and
- 19 certification service at the Washington State University research and
- 20 extension center at Puyallup.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Washington State University, in
- 22 cooperation with the University of Washington, shall establish a
- 23 training program in the field of aquatic animal health and disease.
- 24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 1 through 3 of this act shall
- 25 constitute a new chapter in Title 15 RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) The sum of six hundred seventy-three
- 2 thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is
- 3 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general
- 4 fund to the department of agriculture to carry out the purposes of
- 5 section 2 of this act. Of this amount (a) five hundred twenty-three
- 6 thousand dollars is provided solely for staffing and operating the
- 7 diagnostic and extension laboratory established under section 2 of this
- 8 act; and (b) one hundred fifty thousand dollars is provided solely for
- 9 any remodeling of the Washington State University research and
- 10 extension center at Puyallup and the purchase of start-up equipment
- 11 necessary to carry out the purpose of section 2 of this act.
- 12 (2) The sum of fifty-four thousand dollars, or as much thereof as
- 13 may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending June 30,
- 14 1993, from the general fund to the Washington State University to carry
- 15 out the purposes of section 3 of this act.
- 16 (3) No amounts appropriated under this section may be expended
- 17 until at least twenty-seven thousand dollars or in-kind contributions
- 18 of services, facilities, or materials from nonstate sources has been
- 19 contributed for the purposes of section 3 of this act.
