- AN ACT Relating to terms of office; and amending RCW 43.01.010 and
- 2 44.04.021.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 43.01.010 and 1965 c 8 s 43.01.010 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) The governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state,
- 7 treasurer, auditor, attorney general, superintendent of public
- 8 instruction, commissioner of public lands, and insurance commissioner,
- 9 shall hold office for the term of four years, and until their
- 10 successors are elected and qualified; and the term shall commence on
- 11 the Wednesday after the second Monday of January following their
- 12 election.
- 13 (2) No person may hold any office listed in subsection (1) of this
- 14 section, the office of state senator or state representative, or any
- 15 combination of such offices for more than twelve years, whether such

- 1 office or offices are held consecutively or nonconsecutively. A person
- 2 may not file for or be appointed to any office listed in subsection (1)
- 3 of this section if serving the term or remainder of the term would
- 4 <u>violate the twelve-year limitation of this subsection</u>. Service in any
- 5 of the offices listed in subsection (1) of this section before
- 6 Wednesday after the second Monday in January 1993 shall not be used
- 7 when applying the twelve-year limitation of this subsection.
- 8 Sec. 2. RCW 44.04.021 and 1987 c 13 s 1 are each amended to read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 (1) The regular term of office of each senator and representative
- 11 shall commence on the second Monday in January following the date of
- 12 election.
- 13 (2) No person may hold the office of senator or representative, any
- 14 office listed in RCW 43.01.010(1), or any combination of such offices
- 15 for more than twelve years, whether such office or offices are held
- 16 consecutively or nonconsecutively. A person may not file for or be
- 17 appointed to the office of senator or representative if serving the
- 18 term or remainder of the term would violate the twelve-year limitation
- 19 of this subsection. Service in the office of senator or representative
- 20 before the second Monday in January 1993 shall not be used when
- 21 applying the twelve-year limitation of this subsection.
