- 1 AN ACT Relating to the veterans affairs advisory committee; and
- 2 amending RCW 43.60A.080.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.60A.080 and 1987 c 59 s 1 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) There is hereby created a state veterans affairs advisory
- 7 committee which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and
- 8 the director of the department of veterans affairs. The committee
- 9 shall be composed of ((fifteen)) sixteen members to be appointed by the
- 10 governor, and shall consist of two veterans at large, one of whom shall
- 11 be a Vietnam era veteran; one representative of the Washington
- 12 soldiers' home and colony at Orting; one representative of the
- 13 Washington veterans' home at Retsil; and one representative of each of
- 14 the following congressionally chartered veterans organizations:
- 15 American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Veterans of World

- 1 War II, Korea and Vietnam, Disabled American Veterans, Military Order
- 2 of the Purple Heart, Marine Corps League, Paralyzed Veterans of
- 3 America, Incorporated, American Ex-prisoners of War, Veterans of World
- 4 War I, Gold Star Mothers, Submarine Veterans of World War II, and the
- 5 Vietnam Veterans of America, Incorporated. The ((eleven)) twelve
- 6 members representing each of the foregoing organizations shall each be
- 7 chosen from three names submitted to the governor by each of the named
- 8 organizations. The first members of the committee shall hold office as
- 9 follows: Three members to serve two years; three members to serve
- 10 three years; and three members to serve four years. The first members
- 11 appointed to represent the soldiers' home and colony at Orting and the
- 12 veterans' home at Retsil shall hold office for four years. Upon
- 13 expiration of said original terms, subsequent appointments shall be for
- 14 four years except in the case of a vacancy, in which event appointment
- 15 shall be only for the remainder of the unexpired term for which the
- 16 vacancy occurs. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 17 (2) The state advisory committee shall have the following powers
- 18 and duties:
- 19 (a) To serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the
- 20 director on all matters pertaining to the department of veterans
- 21 affairs;
- 22 (b) To acquaint themselves fully with the operations of the
- 23 department and recommend such changes to the governor and the director
- 24 as they deem advisable.
- 25 (3) Members of the state advisory committee shall receive no
- 26 compensation for the performance of their duties but shall receive a
- 27 per diem allowance and mileage expense according to the provisions of
- 28 chapter 43.03 RCW.
