- 1 AN ACT Relating to referendum procedures for port district
- 2 resolutions; and adding a new section to chapter 53.12 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 53.12 RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) Resolutions of port districts shall not go into effect before
- 7 thirty days from the time of final passage and are subject to
- 8 referendum during the interim except:
- 9 (a) Resolutions necessary for the immediate preservation of the
- 10 public peace, health, or safety that contain a statement of urgency and
- 11 are passed by unanimous vote of the commission;
- 12 (b) Resolutions providing for local improvement districts;
- 13 (c) Resolutions providing for or approving collective bargaining;
- 14 (d) Resolutions providing for the compensation of or working
- 15 conditions of port employees; and

- 1 (e) Resolutions authorizing or repealing the levy of taxes.
- 2 (2)(a) If within the thirty-day period a petition is filed with the
- 3 county auditor containing the signatures of fifteen percent of the
- 4 registered voters of the district who voted in the last general
- 5 election of the jurisdiction, the county auditor shall canvass the
- 6 signatures in the same manner as prescribed in RCW 29.79.200 and
- 7 certify their sufficiency to the port commission within thirty days.
- 8 The operation of the resolution shall be suspended until the results of
- 9 the special election are certified.
- 10 (b) Immediately after the auditor's certificate of sufficiency is
- 11 issued, the auditor shall call a special election on the date specified
- 12 in RCW 29.13.020 that immediately follows a forty-five day period
- 13 beginning on the date the certificate of sufficiency is issued. The
- 14 special election shall be conducted as provided by law. If a majority
- 15 of the voters voting on the resolution favor the resolution, it shall
- 16 become effective immediately upon certification of the election.
- 17 (3) This section does not apply to resolutions subject to the
- 18 election procedures in RCW 53.36.100 or 53.54.040.
