## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5284

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to opportunities for instruction in braille; adding
- 2 a new section to chapter 28A.320 RCW; and adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 28A.405 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.320
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) Each school district in the state and the Washington state
- 8 school for the blind shall increase their efforts to provide the
- 9 opportunity to receive instruction in braille to blind students
- 10 attending school within the district. The instruction shall be
- 11 provided in a manner that teaches the usefulness and benefits of
- 12 braille as a system of reading and writing for persons who are blind.
- 13 If a school district does not provide the opportunity to receive
- 14 instruction in braille to a blind student, after such services have
- 15 been requested, the school district shall state in writing why such

- 1 services were not provided and transmit a copy of the report to the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction. The school district shall also
- 3 include information about any students provided with instruction in
- 4 braille.
- 5 (2) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions
- 6 in this section apply throughout this section.
- 7 (a) "Blind" means:
- 8 (i) Having a visual acuity of not more than 20/200 in the better
- 9 eye with correction;
- 10 (ii) Having a central visual field that subtends an angle of not
- 11 more than twenty degrees in the better eye with correction;
- 12 (iii) Having nystagmus in at least one eye; or
- 13 (iv) Having an eye condition that may develop into a condition
- 14 meeting either (i), (ii), or (iii) of this subsection (a).
- 15 (b) "Braille" means the system of raised dots commonly used for
- 16 reading and writing by the blind in the versions approved by the
- 17 braille authority of North America including but not limited to the
- 18 following codes or revisions of codes adopted by the braille authority
- 19 of North America:
- 20 (i) Standard english braille, grade two;
- 21 (ii) The Nemeth braille code for mathematics and science notation,
- 22 1972 revision;
- 23 (iii) The revised international manual of braille music notation
- 24 1956 and the 1975 American addendum; and
- 25 (iv) The code for computer braille notation, 1987.
- 26 (c) "Instruction in braille" means instruction in reading braille
- 27 by touch and in writing braille using the slate and stylus, Perkins
- 28 braillewriter, and when appropriate, computer software and hardware.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.405
- 2 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 (1) Within two years after the effective date of this section and
- 4 thereafter, certificated instructional staff holding certificates or
- 5 endorsements qualifying them to provide special education services who
- 6 are providing instruction to blind students in reading or writing shall
- 7 work towards developing competency in braille.
- 8 (2) As used in this section, "competency in braille" means having
- 9 written proof of successful completion of:
- 10 (a) The course in literary braille for braille transcribers
- 11 administered by the United States library of congress;
- 12 (b) Any test created or endorsed by the United States library of
- 13 congress to certify proficiency of educational personnel in braille;
- 14 (c) A course for braille transcribers administered by the
- 15 Washington state regional library for the blind; or
- 16 (d) A course approved by the state board of education equivalent to
- 17 the courses in (a), (b), or (c) of this subsection.
