## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5341

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time March 4, 1991.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to insurance for foster parents; amending RCW
- 2 4.24.190; adding a new section to chapter 74.14B RCW; creating a new
- 3 section; and declaring an emergency.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the unique
- risks that foster parents face in taking children into their care.
- 7 Third parties may file claims against foster parents for property
- losses and damage caused by foster children, nearly all of whom "act 8
- 9 out" their emotional pain. The legislature finds that some potential
- 10 foster parents are unwilling to subject themselves to such liability
- 11 without insurance protection. The legislature further finds that to
- 12 encourage those people to serve as foster parents, it is necessary to
- 13 assure that such insurance is available to them.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.14B RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The secretary of social and health services shall provide
- 4 liability insurance to foster parents licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW.
- 5 The coverage shall not exceed five hundred thousand dollars for
- 6 personal injury and property damage alleged to have occurred within
- 7 their capacity as foster parents. However, no money shall be paid from
- 8 liability insurance under this section unless all proceeds available to
- 9 the claimant from any valid and collectible liability insurance shall
- 10 have been exhausted. However, such insurance may not cover illegal
- 11 conduct or bad faith acts taken in providing foster care on the part of
- 12 the foster parents.
- 13 (2) The secretary of social and health services may purchase the
- 14 insurance required in subsection (1) of this section or may choose a
- 15 self-insurance method.
- 16 (3) Nothing in this section is intended to modify the foster parent
- 17 reimbursement plan in place on the effective date of this act.
- 18 (4) The liability insurance program shall be available by July 1,
- 19 1991.
- 20 **Sec. 3.** RCW 4.24.190 and 1977 ex.s. c 145 s 1 are each amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 (1) The parent or parents of any minor child under the age of
- 23 eighteen years who is living with the parent or parents and who shall
- 24 wilfully or maliciously destroy property, real or personal or mixed, or
- 25 who shall wilfully and maliciously inflict personal injury on another
- 26 person, shall be liable to the owner of such property or to the person
- 27 injured in a civil action at law for damages in an amount not to exceed
- 28 three thousand dollars. This section shall in no way limit the amount

- 1 of recovery against the parent or parents for their own common law
- 2 negligence.
- 3 (2) The liability of foster parents licensed pursuant to chapter
- 4 74.15 RCW for the care and supervision of foster children shall be the
- 5 same as the liability of biological and adoptive parents for the care
- 6 and supervision of their children.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 9 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 10 effect immediately.
