- 1 AN ACT Relating to insurance for foster parents; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 74.14B RCW; adding a new section to chapter 4.24
- 3 RCW; and creating new sections.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes the unique
- 6 risks that foster parents face in taking children into their care.
- 7 Third parties may file claims against foster parents for losses and
- 8 damage caused by foster children. The legislature finds that some
- 9 potential foster parents are unwilling to subject themselves to such
- 10 potential liability without insurance protection. The legislature
- 11 further finds that to encourage those people to serve as foster
- 12 parents, it is necessary to assure that such insurance is available to
- 13 them.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.14B RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, the secretary of
- 4 social and health services shall provide liability insurance to foster
- 5 parents licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW. The coverage shall be for
- 6 personal injury and property damage alleged to have occurred within
- 7 their capacity as foster parents. Such insurance may not provide
- 8 coverage for illegal conduct or bad faith acts taken in providing
- 9 foster care on the part of the foster parents. No money shall be paid
- 10 from liability insurance under this section unless all proceeds
- 11 available to the claimant from any other valid and collectible
- 12 liability insurance shall have been exhausted.
- 13 (2) The secretary of social and health services may purchase the
- 14 insurance required in subsection (1) of this section or may choose a
- 15 self-insurance method. The total moneys expended pursuant to this
- 16 authorization shall not exceed five hundred thousand dollars per
- 17 biennium. If the secretary elects a method of self-insurance, the
- 18 expenditure shall include all administrative and staff costs. If the
- 19 secretary elects a method of self-insurance, he or she may, by rule,
- 20 place a limit on the maximum amount to be paid on each claim.
- 21 (3) Nothing in this section or section 3 of this act is intended to
- 22 modify the foster parent reimbursement plan in place on the effective
- 23 date of this act.
- 24 (4) The liability insurance program shall be available by July 1,
- 25 1991.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 4.24 RCW
- 27 to read as follows:
- The liability of foster parents licensed pursuant to chapter 74.15
- 29 RCW for the care and supervision of foster children shall be the same

- 1 as the liability of biological and adoptive parents for the care and
- 2 supervision of their children.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** If specific funding for the purposes of
- 4 this act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided by June
- 5 30, 1991, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act shall be null and
- 6 void.
