8 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
9 conditions and limitations:

10 (1) This appropriation is provided solely to provide portable
11 classrooms for school districts that have experienced an unanticipated
12 school housing emergency. Portable classrooms provided under this
13 section shall be leased by the superintendent of public instruction to
14 school districts, and the lease payments shall be deposited into the
15 common school construction fund. School districts may qualify for
16 assistance under this section only as a result of events barring
17 students from occupying a school or a portion of a school, and
18 portables shall not be provided under this section to address needs
19 attributable to enrollment growth. The superintendent of public
20 instruction shall provide assistance to a school district under this
21 section only if satisfied that the district has considered other
22 available options and that portable classrooms are the most feasible
23 solution to school housing needs.—

24 (2) Districts receiving assistance under this section shall submit
25 a plan to replace or reopen their closed facilities prior to the end of
26 the lease period, and shall certify that resources are available to
27 meet all terms of the lease.

28 (3) For the purposes of this section, the term "lease" includes a
29 lease with option to purchase.))

30 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
31 conditions and limitations:

32 (1) The state board of education, the superintendent of public
33 instruction and the office of financial management shall jointly
34 conduct and manage a project to develop revisions to the current K-12
35 capital funding process. The goal of the project is to (a) achieve a
36 state-wide prioritization of K-12 capital projects that is based on
37 sound planning, accurate cost estimates, and applicable state capital
38 budget process instructions; (b) achieve a system that fits efficiently
39 and effectively into a total state process; and (c) achieve a system
40 that adequately addresses the maintenance of both existing investments
41 and addition of new facilities.

42 (2) The state board of education shall perform a state study and
43 survey to determine the condition of need in compliance with RCW
44 28A.47.080 of up to one hundred fifty school districts. The state
45 board of education shall survey districts in a priority order based on
46 anticipated projects. The studies must be performed in one of the
47 following ways:

48 (a) By staff working for the state board of education;

49 (b) By other state agency staff who are paid through an interagency
50 agreement;

51 (c) By private consultants hired by the state board of education.

52 (3) The objectives of the project are to consider revisions that
53 will:

- 1 (a) Require preplanning studies for major projects to determine
2 project scope, cost and alternatives;
3 (b) Require detailed cost and timeline data for each capital
4 request;
5 (c) Require analysis by the superintendent of public instruction
6 staff of cost, timelines, and alternatives of all projects;
7 (d) Require approval by the state board of education of all capital
8 projects;
9 (e) Require a method of monitoring the actual costs and timelines
10 of projects in comparison to those approved;
11 (f) Establish in statute, criteria for funding modernization
12 projects;
13 (g) Establish standards and require evaluation and monitoring of
14 annual maintenance cost by local districts.
15 (4) The completed project and recommended legislation shall be
16 presented to the legislature and the governor by December 1, 1991.
17 (5) The revised funding process shall be implemented by June 30,
18 1992.
19 (6) No debt-supported funding, beyond current bond authorizations
20 for general obligation bonds, will be available for K-12 capital
21 projects until the legislature enacts legislation as recommended in
22 subsection (4) of this section.
