- 1 AN ACT Relating to motorcycle permit restrictions; and amending RCW
- 2 46.20.510.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.510 and 1989 c 337 s 9 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) There shall be three categories for the special motorcycle
- 7 endorsement of a driver's license. Category one shall be for
- 8 motorcycles or motor-driven cycles having an engine displacement of one
- 9 hundred fifty cubic centimeters or less. Category two shall be for
- 10 motorcycles having an engine displacement of five hundred cubic
- 11 centimeters or less. Category three shall include categories one and
- 12 two, and shall be for motorcycles having an engine displacement of five
- 13 hundred one cubic centimeters or more.
- 14 (2) The department may issue a motorcyclist's instruction permit
- 15 for a period not to exceed ninety days to an individual who ((wishes to

learn to ride a motorcycle)) has satisfactorily completed a motorcycle 1 2 rider course approved by the department or wishes to obtain an endorsement of a larger endorsement category ((for a period not to 3 4 exceed ninety days)). This motorcyclist's instruction permit may be renewed for an additional ninety days. The director shall collect a 5 6 two dollar and fifty cent fee for the motorcyclist's instruction permit or renewal, and the fee shall be deposited in the motorcycle safety 7 education account of the highway safety fund. This permit and a valid 8 9 driver's license with current endorsement, if any, shall be carried 10 when operating a motorcycle. An individual with a motorcyclist's instruction permit may not carry passengers ((-)) and may not operate a 11 12 motorcycle during the hours of darkness or on a fully-controlled, 13 limited-access facility((, and shall be under the direct visual 14 supervision of a person with a motorcycle endorsement of the appropriate category and at least five years' riding experience)). 15
