- 1 AN ACT Relating to credit for military service under the teachers'
- 2 retirement system; amending RCW 41.32.260; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 41.32.260 and 1974 ex.s. c 199 s 2 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1)(a) Any member whose public school service is interrupted by
- 7 active service to ((the United States as a member of its military,
- 8 naval or air service, or to)) the state of Washington, as a member of
- 9 the legislature, may upon becoming reemployed in the public schools,
- 10 receive credit for such service upon presenting satisfactory proof, and
- 11 contributing to the annuity fund, either in a lump sum or installments,
- 12 such amounts as shall be determined by the ((board of trustees:
- 13 PROVIDED (1), That no such military service credit in excess of five
- 14 years shall be established or reestablished after July 1, 1961, unless

- 1 the service was actually rendered during time of war: PROVIDED FURTHER
- 2 (2), That)) <u>director</u>.
- 3 (b) A member of the retirement system who is a member of the state
- 4 legislature or a state official eligible for the combined pension and
- 5 annuity provided by RCW 41.32.497, or 41.32.498, as now or hereafter
- 6 amended shall have deductions taken from his or her salary in the
- 7 amount of seven and one-half percent of earnable compensation and that
- 8 service credit shall be established with the retirement system while
- 9 such deductions are reported to the retirement system, unless he or she
- 10 has by reason of his or her employment become a contributing member of
- 11 another public retirement system in the state of Washington((: AND
- 12 PROVIDED FURTHER (3), That)).
- 13 (c) Such elected official who has retired or otherwise terminated
- 14 his or her public school service may then elect to terminate his or her
- 15 membership in the retirement system and receive retirement benefits
- 16 while continuing to serve as an elected official((: AND, PROVIDED
- 17 **FURTHER** (4), That)).
- 18 (d) A member of the retirement system who had previous service as
- 19 an elected or appointed official, for which he or she did not
- 20 contribute to the retirement system, may receive credit for such
- 21 legislative service unless he or she has received credit for that
- 22 service in another state retirement system, upon making contributions
- 23 in such amounts as shall be determined by the board of trustees.
- 24 (2)(a) Any member whose public school service is interrupted by
- 25 active service to the United States as a member of its military, naval,
- 26 or air service, may upon becoming reemployed in the public schools,
- 27 receive credit for such service upon presenting satisfactory proof:
- 28 PROVIDED, That no such military service credit in excess of five years
- 29 shall be established or reestablished after July 1, 1961, unless the
- 30 <u>service was actually rendered during time of war.</u>

- 1 (b) After completing twenty-five years of creditable service, any
- 2 member may have the member's service in the armed forces credited to
- 3 the member if the service was prior to membership, but in no instance
- 4 shall such military service in excess of five years be credited. This
- 5 <u>subsection (2)(b) does not apply to any individual who is not a veteran</u>
- 6 within the meaning of RCW 41.04.005. Military service shall not be
- 7 credited to any member who is receiving full military retirement
- 8 benefits pursuant to Title 10 of the United States Code.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 11 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 12 effect immediately.
