- 1 AN ACT Relating to Pacific Rim education programs; amending RCW
- 2 28B.107.010, 28B.107.030, 28B.107.040, 28B.107.050, 28A.630.320,
- 3 28A.630.340, and 28A.300.200; repealing RCW 28B.107.900 and
- 4 28A.405.020; and making appropriations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.107.010 and 1990 c 243 s 2 are each amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
- 9 this section apply throughout this chapter.
- 10 (1) "Washington state Pacific Rim language scholarship" means a
- 11 scholarship awarded((,)) for ((a period not to exceed)) one year, and
- 12 renewable for a period not to exceed four years, to a student
- 13 proficient in speaking one of the following languages: Spanish
- 14 Russian, Chinese, ((and)) Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Thai, or Vietnamese.

- 1 (2) "Institution of higher education" or "institution" means a
- 2 college or university in the state of Washington that is accredited by
- 3 an accrediting association recognized as such by rule of the higher
- 4 education coordinating board.
- 5 (3) "Board" means the higher education coordinating board.
- 6 (4) "Student" means a high school senior who is a proficient
- 7 speaker of a Pacific Rim language, and who intends to enroll in an
- 8 institution of higher education within one year of high school
- 9 graduation.
- 10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.107.030 and 1990 c 243 s 4 are each amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (1) The board shall select up to ((four)) eight students yearly
- 13 from each congressional district to receive ((a)) an initial Washington
- 14 state Pacific Rim scholarship from funds appropriated for this purpose.
- 15 Of the ((four)) eight students selected, one student shall be a
- 16 proficient speaker of Spanish, one of Russian, one of Japanese, ((and))
- 17 one of Chinese, one of Khmer, one of Korean, one of Thai, and one of
- 18 <u>Vietnamese</u>. If there are no qualified applicants for a particular
- 19 scholarship, the board may select a student from qualified applicants
- 20 <u>in other languages or congressional districts.</u>
- 21 (2) To be eligible for a scholarship, students shall have taken
- 22 <u>coursework in the language</u>, or the culture or history related to the
- 23 language, during their high school careers, or be native speakers of
- 24 the language.
- 25 (3) Using measures as objective as possible, the board shall select
- 26 students ((who have shown the most improvement in their ability to
- 27 speak the language during their high school careers)) on the following
- 28 <u>criteria: Degree of oral proficiency in the Pacific Rim language;</u>
- 29 <u>improvement in ability to speak the language during his or her high</u>

- 1 school career; and demonstrated potential to teach or otherwise use the
- 2 language to enrich the state's cultural understanding or economic
- 3 <u>health</u>.
- 4 Sec. 3. RCW 28B.107.040 and 1990 c 243 s 5 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Scholarships shall not exceed one thousand dollars per student per
- 7 year. The scholarship shall not be disbursed to the student until the
- 8 student is enrolled at an institution of higher education. The board
- 9 may also use private donations or any other funds given to the board
- 10 for this program to make additional scholarship awards. Funds shall be
- 11 spent first for new scholarships. If funds are available after
- 12 providing new scholarships, funds may be used to renew scholarships
- 13 issued before or after the effective date of this section.
- 14 Sec. 4. RCW 28B.107.050 and 1990 c 243 s 6 are each amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 By October 30, 1995, the board shall report on the progress of the
- 17 program to the governor and the house of representatives and senate
- 18 committees on higher education. ((The report shall include a
- 19 recommendation on whether to expand the number of languages included,
- 20 and whether to expand the program to students in each legislative
- 21 district.))
- 22 **Sec. 5.** RCW 28A.630.320 and 1990 c 33 s 534 are each amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (1) The superintendent of public instruction may grant funds to
- 25 selected school districts for the purposes of developing and
- 26 implementing international education programs. The grants shall be in
- 27 such amounts as determined by the superintendent of public instruction.

- 1 The sum of all grants awarded shall not exceed the amount appropriated
- 2 by the legislature for such purposes.
- 3 (2) The grant program shall center on the use of the international
- 4 education model curriculum or curriculum guidelines developed in RCW
- 5 28A.630.310. Districts may use the international education model
- 6 curriculum or curriculum guidelines developed under RCW 28A.630.310 as
- 7 a guideline for creating their own model curriculum for participation
- 8 in the grant program.
- 9 (3) School districts may apply singularly or a group of school
- 10 districts may apply together to participate in the program.
- 11 (4) School districts applying for the international education
- 12 grant program shall submit a plan which includes:
- 13 (a) ((Participation by the school district in both the model
- 14 curriculum or curriculum guidelines development activities and the
- 15 grant program activities provided for by RCW 28A.630.300 through
- 16 28A.630.390)) Use of the curriculum guidelines developed under RCW
- 17 <u>28A.630.310</u>;
- 18 (b) ((The application or)) Intent to conduct a foreign language
- 19 program including ((either Japanese or Mandarin Chinese)) at least two
- 20 of the following languages: Spanish, Russian, Chinese, Japanese,
- 21 Khmer, Korean, Thai, and Vietnamese, beginning in the ninth grade;
- 22 (c) A staff in-service training program addressing the
- 23 implementation of international education curriculum;
- 24 (d) A goal to enlist participation where possible by private
- 25 enterprise, cultural and ethnic associations, foreign trade or policy
- 26 organizations, the local community, exchange students and students who
- 27 have participated in exchange programs, and parents;
- 28 (e) Evaluation of the pilot program.

- 1 (5) To the extent possible, selected school districts shall
- 2 represent the various geographical locations, school or school district
- 3 sizes, and grade levels in the state.
- 4 (6) By January 1, ((1988)) 1992, the superintendent of public
- 5 instruction shall select five school district grantees for the program.
- 6 The program shall be implemented beginning with the ((1988-89)) 1992-93
- 7 school year.
- 8 (7) The program in international education shall be considered a
- 9 social studies offering for the purpose of RCW 28A.230.090(1) and may
- 10 also, if appropriate, be used to meet foreign language requirements.
- 11 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28A.630.340 and 1987 c 349 s 5 are each amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 The superintendent of public instruction shall submit a report to
- 14 the legislature, including its findings and specific recommendations
- 15 evaluating the progress of the grant program, by January 1, ((1991))
- 16 <u>1995</u>.
- 17 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28A.300.200 and 1990 c 243 s 9 are each amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 To complement RCW 28A.630.320 and chapter 28B.107 RCW, the
- 20 superintendent of public instruction shall ((encourage school districts
- 21 to establish exchange programs for teachers with)) coordinate and
- 22 sponsor teacher exchanges between Washington schools and schools in
- 23 Pacific Rim nations. The superintendent may solicit and accept grants
- 24 and donations from public and private sources for the teacher exchange
- 25 program.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** The following acts or parts of acts are
- 27 each repealed:

- 1 (1) RCW 28B.107.900 and 1990 c 243 s 8; and
- 2 (2) RCW 28A.405.020 and 1990 c 243 s 7, 1985 c 379 s 5, 1977 ex.s.
- 3 c 340 s 1, & 1969 ex.s. c 223 s 28A.67.020.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** (1) The sum of two hundred fifty-two
- 5 thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is
- 6 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general
- 7 fund to the higher education coordinating board for the purposes of
- 8 sections 1 through 4 of this act.
- 9 (2) The sum of five hundred twenty-five thousand dollars, or as
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 11 ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the superintendent of
- 12 public instruction for the purposes of sections 5 and 6 of this act.
- 13 (a) Up to twenty-five thousand dollars of the appropriation in this
- 14 subsection may be used for the international education grant program in
- 15 section 5 of this act.
- 16 (b) Up to five hundred thousand dollars of the appropriation in
- 17 this subsection may be used for the teacher exchange program in section
- 18 6 of this act.
