Read first time February 7, 1991. Referred to Committee on Education.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to programs for students with learning problems;
- 2 amending RCW 28A.630.050 and 28A.630.060; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 28A.630 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.630.050 and 1990 c 33 s 522 are each amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) The superintendent of public instruction ((may)) shall select
- 8 at least two and up to ((five)) ten school districts to participate in
- 9 a pilot program for prevention of learning problems and academic
- 10 delays. The program shall begin with the 1989-90 school year and
- 11 conclude at the end of the $((\frac{1990-91}{1994-95}))$ school year.
- 12 (2) If at the end of a pilot school year, for school years 1989-90
- 13 and 1990-91, the number of specific learning disabled students served
- 14 by a participating school district in handicapped education programs
- 15 has decreased as a result of the pilot project, the district shall be

- 1 reimbursed based upon the number, or percentage, whichever is greater,
- 2 of specific learning disabled students served in special education
- 3 during the school year prior to commencement of the pilot project.
- 4 These funds will be used to support the pilot project for prevention of
- 5 learning problems and academic delays: PROVIDED, That school districts
- 6 participating in the pilot prevention program established under this
- 7 section who have ongoing pilot projects previously approved by the
- 8 superintendent of public instruction shall utilize the school year
- 9 prior to initiation of such pilot project as the base for the
- 10 reimbursement calculation under this subsection when the number of
- 11 specific learning disabled students identified has decreased as a
- 12 result of participation in the pilot program established under this
- 13 section. Beginning in school year 1991-92, participating districts
- 14 shall be reimbursed based on four percent of the total school district
- 15 <u>full-time equivalent student enrollment.</u>
- 16 (3) School districts applying to participate in the pilot program
- 17 established under this section shall submit to the superintendent of
- 18 public instruction a proposed program budget for the ((1989-90 school
- 19 year and a preliminary budget plan for the 1990-91)) first school year
- 20 of participation. These proposed budgets or budget plans shall outline
- 21 the resources to be used by the district in the identification and
- 22 early prevention of learning problems. Districts selected to
- 23 participate shall submit an updated budget proposal to the
- 24 superintendent of public instruction prior to the ((1990-91)) each
- 25 <u>subsequent</u> school year.
- 26 (4) Applications submitted by school districts shall also include:
- 27 (a) Assurances that the school district will not deny access to
- 28 special education programs for handicapped students entitled to
- 29 services under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100;

- 1 (b) A description of methods to be used by the district to identify
- 2 students for additional instruction or other services provided under
- 3 the pilot project;
- 4 (c) A description of the types of instructional programs or
- 5 services to be used in prevention of learning problems;
- 6 (d) A plan for evaluating the effectiveness of the district's
- 7 project at the end of ((the 1990-91)) each school year, using student
- 8 test scores and other indicators of academic progress and, as
- 9 appropriate, vocational progress, as determined by the district; and
- 10 (e) Other information as may be required by the superintendent of
- 11 public instruction.
- 12 (5) For the purposes of this section, "state allocation for
- 13 handicapped students" includes state handicapped education moneys
- 14 allocated for students served in special education programs provided
- 15 under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100 and basic education
- 16 allocations generated by such students under the state funding formula
- 17 adopted pursuant to RCW 28A.150.260.
- 18 (6) This section shall expire December 31, $((\frac{1991}{1995}))$ 1995.
- 19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.630.060 and 1990 c 33 s 523 are each amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (1) Prior to December 1, 1991, the superintendent of public
- 22 instruction shall submit a report on the pilot program established
- 23 under RCW 28A.630.050 to the legislature and the governor. The report
- 24 shall include an analysis of the effectiveness of the program and
- 25 recommendations on whether the program should be ((continued or))
- 26 expanded to other districts.
- 27 (2) Prior to December 1, 1995, the superintendent of public
- 28 instruction shall submit a report on the pilot program established
- 29 <u>under RCW 28A.630.050 to the legislature and the governor. The report</u>

- 1 shall include an analysis of the effectiveness of the program and
- 2 recommendations on whether the program should be continued or expanded
- 3 to other districts.
- 4 (3) This section shall expire December 31, $((\frac{1991}{1995}))$ 1995.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) The superintendent of public
- 6 instruction shall create an implementation review board for the pilot
- 7 program for prevention of learning problems which shall be made up of
- 8 one representative from each of the participating districts. The
- 9 members of the implementation review board shall review all rules
- 10 adopted by the superintendent of public instruction pertaining to this
- 11 program and report to the legislature and governor before December 1,
- 12 1991, on ways to improve or reduce the paperwork necessary to conduct
- 13 this program.
- 14 (2) This section shall expire December 31, 1991.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.630
- 16 RCW to read as follows:
- 17 The superintendent of public instruction may create a new program
- 18 code in the accounting manual for public school districts in the state
- 19 of Washington to track expenditures and revenues related to RCW
- 20 28A.630.050 and 28A.630.060.
