## SENATE BILL 5618

- AN ACT Relating to voter registration; amending RCW 29.07.160; and
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 29.07 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 29.07.160 and 1980 c 3 s 4 are each amended to read as
- 5 follows:
- 6 The registration files of all precincts shall be closed against
- 7 original registration or transfers for thirty days immediately
- 8 preceding every primary, special election, and general election ((and
- 9 primary)) to be held in such precincts((, respectively)).
- 10 The county auditor shall give notice of the closing of ((said)) the
- 11 <u>precinct</u> files for original registration and transfer <u>and notice of the</u>
- 12 <u>special registration and voting procedure provided by section 2 of this</u>
- 13 act by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the
- 14 county at least five days before ((such)) the closing((, except as

- 1 provided for special elections in accordance with section 3 of this
- 2 1980 act)) of the precinct files.
- 3 No person may vote at any primary, special election, or general
- 4 <u>election in a precinct polling place unless he or she has registered to</u>
- 5 vote at least thirty days before that primary or election. If a
- 6 person, otherwise qualified to vote in the state, county, and precinct
- 7 in which he or she applies for registration, does not register at least
- 8 thirty days before any primary, special election, or general election,
- 9 he or she may register and vote by absentee ballot for that primary or
- 10 <u>election under section 2 of this act.</u>
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 29.07 RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 After the closing of registration for voting at the polls under RCW
- 14 29.07.160, but not later than twenty days before a primary, special
- 15 election, or general election, an unregistered qualified elector may
- 16 register in person in the office of the county auditor or at a voter
- 17 registration location specifically designated for this purpose by the
- 18 county auditor of the county in which the applicant resides, and apply
- 19 for an absentee ballot for that primary or election. The auditor or
- 20 voter registrar shall register that individual in the manner provided
- 21 in this chapter. The application for an absentee ballot executed by
- 22 the newly registered voter for the primary or election that follows the
- 23 execution of the registration shall be promptly transmitted to the
- 24 auditor with the completed voter registration form.
