SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5629

- 1 AN ACT Relating to acts committed against animal facilities;
- 2 amending RCW 9.08.065; adding new sections to chapter 9.08 RCW;
- 3 prescribing penalties; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** There has been an increasing number of
- 6 illegal acts committed against animal production and research
- 7 facilities involving injury or loss of life to animals or humans,
- 8 criminal trespass, and damage to property. These actions not only
- 9 abridge the property rights of the owners, operators, and employees of
- 10 the facility, they may also damage the public interest by jeopardizing
- 11 crucial animal production or agricultural, scientific, or biomedical
- 12 research. These actions may also threaten the public safety by
- 13 exposing communities to public health concerns and creating traffic
- 14 hazards. These actions substantially disrupt or damage research and
- 15 result in the potential loss of physical and intellectual property.

- 1 Therefore, it is in the interest of the people of the state of
- 2 Washington to protect the welfare of humans and animals, as well as the
- 3 productive use of private or public funds, to require regulation to
- 4 prevent unauthorized possession, alteration, destruction, or
- 5 transportation of research records, test data, research materials,
- 6 equipment, and research and agricultural production animals.
- 7 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9.08.065 and 1989 c 359 s 1 are each amended to read
- 8 as follows:
- 9 (1) As used in this chapter:
- 10 (a) "Animal" means every living creature, domestic or wild, but
- 11 does not include man.
- 12 (b) "Animal facility" means any facility engaging in legal
- 13 agricultural production or scientific research involving the use of
- 14 <u>animals including</u>, but not limited to: Any organization with a primary
- 15 purpose of representing the production, processing, promoting, or
- 16 <u>marketing of livestock or livestock products; any person licensed to</u>
- 17 practice veterinary medicine; and any organization with a primary
- 18 purpose of representing any such person, organization, or institution.
- 19 "Animal facility" shall include the owners, operators, or employees of
- 20 any animal facility and any premises where animals are located.
- 21 <u>(2)</u> As used in RCW 9.08.070:
- $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (a) "Pet animal" means a tamed or domesticated animal
- 23 legally retained by a person and kept as a companion. "Pet animal"
- 24 does not include livestock raised for commercial purposes.
- 25 (((2))) (b) "Research institution" means a facility licensed by the
- 26 United States department of agriculture to use animals in biomedical or
- 27 product research.
- 28 $((\frac{3}{3}))$ <u>(c)</u> "U.S.D.A. licensed dealer" means a person who is
- 29 licensed or required to be licensed by the United States department of

- 1 agriculture to commercially buy, receive, sell, negotiate for sale, or
- 2 transport animals.
- 3 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person:
- 4 (1) To release, steal, or otherwise intentionally cause the death,
- 5 injury, or loss of any animal of, at, or from an animal facility and
- 6 not authorized by that facility;
- 7 (2) To damage, vandalize, or steal any property in, of, or on an
- 8 animal facility;
- 9 (3) To obtain access to an animal facility, or the property of an
- 10 animal facility, for the purpose of performing acts not authorized by
- 11 that facility;
- 12 (4) To enter into an animal facility or the property of an animal
- 13 facility with an intent to destroy, alter, duplicate, or obtain
- 14 unauthorized possession of records, data, materials, equipment, or
- 15 animals;
- 16 (5) To steal, obtain control of, or exert control over records,
- 17 data, material, equipment, animals of any animal facility, or the
- 18 property of an animal facility, for the purpose of depriving the
- 19 rightful owner or animal facility of the records, material, data,
- 20 equipment, or animals or for the purpose of concealing, abandoning, or
- 21 destroying such records, material, data, equipment, or animals;
- 22 (6) To enter or remain on an animal facility, or the property of an
- 23 animal facility, with the intent to commit an act prohibited under this
- 24 section; or
- 25 (7) To interfere with or harass an owner, operator, or employee of
- 26 an animal facility.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1)(a) Any person who violates any
- 28 provision of section 3 of this act shall be guilty of a gross

- 1 misdemeanor for each such violation, unless the loss, cost, theft, or
- 2 damage to an animal facility and its property exceeds two hundred fifty
- 3 dollars in value.
- 4 (b) If the loss, cost, theft, or damage to an animal facility and
- 5 its property exceeds two hundred fifty dollars in value but does not
- 6 exceed one thousand five hundred dollars in value, the person is guilty
- 7 of a class C felony.
- 8 (c) If the loss, cost, theft, or damage to an animal facility and
- 9 its property exceeds one thousand five hundred dollars in value, the
- 10 person is guilty of a class B felony.
- 11 (2) A person who, with the intent that any violation of any
- 12 provision of section 3 of this act be committed, agrees with another to
- 13 the commission of the violation and commits an act in furtherance of
- 14 this agreement is guilty of the same class of felony as provided in
- 15 this section for that violation.
- 16 (3)(a) The court shall conduct a hearing to determine the cost of
- 17 replacing materials, data, equipment, animals, and records that may
- 18 have been damaged, destroyed, lost, stolen, or cannot be returned, and
- 19 the reasonable cost of repeating any experimentation that may have been
- 20 interrupted or invalidated as a result of a violation of section 3 of
- 21 this act.
- 22 (b) Any persons convicted of such violation shall be ordered
- 23 jointly and severally to make restitution within thirty days of such
- 24 order to the owners, operators, or employees, or any combination
- 25 thereof, of the animal facility in the full amount of the cost
- 26 determined under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Nothing in sections 1 and 3 through 5 of
- 28 this act and RCW 9.08.065 shall preclude any animal facility injured in
- 29 its business or property by a violation of sections 1 and 3 through 5

- 1 of this act and RCW 9.08.065 from seeking appropriate relief under any
- 2 other provision of law or remedy including the issuance of a permanent
- 3 injunction against any person who violates any provision of sections 1
- 4 and 3 through 5 of this act and RCW 9.08.065. The animal facility
- 5 owners, operators, or employees may petition the court to permanently
- 6 enjoin such person from violating sections 1 and 3 through 5 of this
- 7 act and RCW 9.08.065 and the court shall provide such relief.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Sections 1 and 3 through 5 of this act
- 9 are each added to chapter 9.08 RCW.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** If any provision of this act or its
- 11 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 12 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 13 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 15 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 16 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 17 effect immediately.
