## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5650

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to community outreach for health; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.70 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that current
- 5 health and social service outreach programs focus primarily on
- 6 multimedia campaigns, telephone hotlines, and professional case finding
- 7 and referrals. These programs may fail to address the access barriers
- 8 experienced by high-risk pregnant and parenting women and their
- 9 families. The legislature finds that active outreach programs using
- 10 indigenous, nonprofessional community members and resources offer
- 11 unique credibility and supports that cannot be duplicated by
- 12 professional efforts or multimedia campaigns. The legislature further
- 13 finds that indigenous community outreach programs achieve health
- 14 improvements comparable or superior to professional or educational
- 15 outreach programs.

- 1 The purpose of sections 1 and 2 of this act is to empower
- 2 individuals, businesses, voluntary community organizations, and others
- 3 to promote health and prevent illness and injury among high-risk
- 4 pregnant and parenting women and their families in their local
- 5 community through active outreach programs using indigenous,
- 6 nonprofessional community members and resources.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The secretary shall assist local health
- 8 departments in establishing pilot local community outreach for health
- 9 programs using indigenous, nonprofessional community volunteers. Local
- 10 health departments shall collaborate with local government and existing
- 11 community-based organizations, including churches, voluntary
- 12 philanthropic or service organizations, businesses, schools, community
- 13 and migrant health clinics, other health care providers, existing local
- 14 outreach programs, and other interested parties to: (1) Identify
- 15 geographic areas and population groups experiencing substantial health
- 16 risks among pregnant and parenting women and their families; and (2)
- 17 develop and coordinate community outreach for health programs targeted
- 18 toward at-risk geographic areas or population groups identified
- 19 according to this section.
- 20 Community outreach programs shall focus on direct contact and may
- 21 provide support, education, referral, or other activities that
- 22 facilitate access to public and private community resources according
- 23 to individual or family need.
- 24 Available funding for community outreach for health programs shall
- 25 be allocated in grants from the department of health based on broad
- 26 community participation, potential for health improvements and
- 27 community empowerment. Applications for grants must provide a fifty
- 28 percent match of funds or in-kind resources from local government,

- 1 community organizations, or other private sources. Volunteer hours may
- 2 be counted against this match at the rate of five dollars per hour.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** If specific funding for this act, citing
- 4 this act by bill number is not provided in the 1991 omnibus
- 5 appropriations act this act shall be null and void.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act are each
- 7 added to chapter 43.70 RCW.
