Read first time March 11, 1991.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the joint select committee on water resource
- 2 policy; amending RCW 90.54.024; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 90.54.024 and 1988 c 47 s 3 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The legislature finds that state-wide water resource policies
- 7 are undergoing transition as state, local, and tribal governments and
- 8 interested parties attempt to confront increasing demands for limited
- 9 <u>water resources</u>. <u>Water resource issues are complex and far-reaching</u>;
- 10 they require vision and foresight in addition to a solid foundation of
- 11 knowledge to quide legislative decision making. It is in the best
- 12 interests of the public that a joint committee of the legislature gain
- 13 particular expertise in water resource issues and actively participate
- 14 with local governments, Indian tribes, and interested parties in the
- 15 <u>development of recommendations for state water resource policy.</u>

- 1 (2) There is hereby created a joint select committee on water
 2 resource policy to address ((the findings reached by the fact-finding
 3 service pursuant to RCW 90.54.022)) the important water resource issues
- 4 of this state, to monitor the implementation of comprehensive regional
- 5 water resource planning and data management required by RCW 90.54.010,
- 6 90.54.030, and 90.54.045, and to otherwise develop an expertise in
- 7 water resource issues in order to advise the legislature regarding
- 8 state water policy. The committee shall consist of twelve voting
- 9 members appointed jointly by the speaker of the house of
- 10 representatives and the president of the senate. The speaker of the
- 11 house of representatives and the president of the senate may each
- 12 appoint nonvoting members to participate in the meetings of the joint
- 13 select committee. The voting membership shall be equally divided from
- 14 each major political caucus and shall, to the extent possible,
- 15 represent all major water interests, including but not limited to
- 16 agriculture, fisheries, municipal, environmental, recreational, and
- 17 hydroelectric.
- 18 $((\frac{1}{2}))$ (3) The staff support shall be provided by the senate
- 19 committee services and the office of program research as mutually
- 20 agreed by the cochairs of the joint select committee. The cochairs
- 21 shall be designated by the speaker of the house of representatives and
- 22 the president of the senate.
- 23 $((\frac{3}{1}))$ In addition to responsibilities identified in
- 24 ((subsection (6) of)) this section, the purpose of the joint select
- 25 committee shall be to address and recommend in ((a)) written annual
- 26 reports to the full legislature the fundamentals of water resource
- 27 policy for the state of Washington. ((The joint select committee shall
- 28 review and evaluate the report of the fact-finding service and shall
- 29 hold a minimum of four public hearings throughout the state.

- 1 The committee shall recommend in its report the procedures for
- 2 allocating water resources of the state, considering the findings of
- 3 the fact-finding service and the present and future demands on the use
- 4 of water resources. The joint select committee shall further evaluate
- 5 the need to prioritize the use of the water resources of this state.
- 6 (4))) The joint select committee shall work with state, tribal, and
- 7 local governments and interested parties to identify significant water
- 8 resource issues and to develop recommendations to the legislature to
- 9 <u>address water resource needs.</u>
- 10 (5) The joint select committee may include in its <u>annual</u> reports to
- 11 the legislature recommendations for revisions to existing laws to set
- 12 forth the water policies of the state and may also recommend revisions
- 13 to existing law to give direction to the department of ecology and
- 14 other agencies and officials in carrying out the fundamental water
- 15 policies of the state as adopted by the legislature. <u>In its 1991</u>
- 16 report to the legislature, the joint select committee shall provide
- 17 <u>information and recommendations regarding the regulatory role of the</u>
- 18 utilities and transportation commission, with particular emphasis on
- 19 problems and recommended solutions associated with financial viability
- 20 of small water systems.
- 21 (((5) The joint select committee shall submit its written report of
- 22 findings and recommendations to the 1989 legislature. A draft report
- 23 shall be completed by December 1, 1988, and distributed to interested
- 24 parties. The final report shall be distributed and a public hearing
- 25 shall be held no later than one week prior to the first day of the 1989
- 26 legislative session.
- 27 (6) The joint select committee shall monitor the actions taken to
- 28 implement the recommendations made in the written report required in
- 29 subsection (5) of this section and the results of any legislation
- 30 enacted affecting the fundamental water resource policies of the state.

- 1 At its discretion, the joint select committee may address issues
- 2 affecting the allocation, efficient use, conservation, or distribution
- 3 of surface and ground water to achieve the maximum benefits to the
- 4 state. The committee shall report periodically to the legislature.
- 5 $\frac{(7)}{(7)}$) (6) This section shall expire June 30, $((\frac{1991}{1993}))$ 1993.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** If specific funding for the purposes of
- 7 this act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided by June
- 8 30, 1991, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act shall be null and
- 9 void.
