SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5724

- 1 AN ACT Relating to water pollution control of chlorinated organic
- 2 compound emissions; adding a new section to chapter 90.48 RCW; creating
- 3 a new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that
- 6 scientifically valid and technically achievable effluent limitations on
- 7 the pulp and paper industry are necessary for the protection of the
- 8 waters of the state of Washington. In order to achieve this objective,
- 9 the department shall:
- 10 (a) Prepare and submit to the legislature a detailed study of the
- 11 impacts of chlorinated organic compound emissions on the state's
- 12 environment from sources within the state. The study shall include an
- 13 analysis of possible effluent limitation levels. For each effluent
- 14 limitation level identified, a detailed analysis of the limitation's
- 15 economic costs of compliance and environmental benefits shall be

- 1 provided. In the study, the department shall designate a recommended
- 2 effluent limitation level for chlorinated organic compounds;
- 3 (b) Submit the study to the legislature by December 31, 1991; and
- 4 (c) Issue no permit establishing limits for the discharge of
- 5 chlorinated organic compounds by a pulp and paper mill under RCW
- 6 90.48.160 or 90.48.260 until the legislature has reviewed and made
- 7 recommendations based on the study required by (a) of this subsection.
- 8 This subsection (c) shall expire on March 31, 1992.
- 9 (2) The department is authorized to utilize the resources of the
- 10 state's universities for appropriate elements of the study and the
- 11 department shall consult with the Puget Sound water quality authority
- 12 and the Columbia river bi-state commission on the subject matter of the
- 13 study.
- 14 (3) In the event that the United States environmental protection
- 15 agency promulgates national effluent guidelines for pulp and paper
- 16 mills limiting emissions of chlorinated organics before the department
- 17 submits its report to the legislature, then the department may issue
- 18 permits containing chlorinated organics emissions limitations
- 19 consistent with the national guidelines.
- 20 (4) Nothing in this section shall apply to dioxin compounds.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 90.48 RCW
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (1) There is hereby created a joint select committee on water
- 24 quality to oversee and review the department's study. The committee
- 25 shall consist of ten voting members appointed jointly by the speaker of
- 26 the house of representatives and the president of the senate. The
- 27 speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate
- 28 may each appoint nonvoting members to participate in the meetings of

- 1 the joint select committee. The voting membership shall be equally
- 2 divided between each major political caucus.
- 3 (2) The senate committee services and the office of program
- 4 research shall provide staff support for the committee or another
- 5 source of staff support may be used if the cochairs of the joint select
- 6 committee mutually agreed to do so. The cochairs shall be designated
- 7 by the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the
- 8 senate.
- 9 (3) The purpose of the joint select committee is to review,
- 10 evaluate, and conduct public hearings on the report of the department
- 11 on chlorinated organic compounds submitted to the legislature.
- 12 (4) The joint select committee shall monitor actions taken by the
- 13 department to implement the recommendations made in the study and shall
- 14 report to the legislature on any changes in the emissions of
- 15 chlorinated organic compounds which it deems appropriate.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 18 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 19 effect immediately.
