- 1 AN ACT Relating to department of licensing agents and subagents;
- 2 amending RCW 46.01.130 and 46.01.140; adding a new section to chapter
- 3 46.01 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; creating a new
- 4 section; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.01.130 and 1979 c 158 s 121 are each amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 The department of licensing shall have the general supervision and
- 9 control of the issuing of vehicle licenses and vehicle license number
- 10 plates and shall have the full power to do all things necessary and
- 11 proper to carry out the provisions of the law relating to the licensing
- 12 of vehicles; the director shall have the power to appoint and employ
- 13 deputies, assistants and representatives, and such clerks as may be
- 14 required from time to time, and to provide for their operation in
- 15 different parts of the state, and the director shall have the power to

- 1 appoint the county auditors of the several counties as his agents for
- 2 the licensing of vehicles. A county auditor so appointed may recommend
- 3 to the director the appointment of one or more persons as subagents of
- 4 the county auditor for vehicle licensing and registration. The
- 5 director may appoint one or more of the persons recommended by the
- 6 county auditor, but if none of the recommendations are approved by the
- 7 director, the county auditor shall submit new recommendations until the
- 8 <u>director appoints one or more subagents for that county.</u>
- 9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.01.140 and 1990 c 250 s 89 are each amended to read
- 10 as follows:
- 11 (1) The county auditor, if appointed by the director of licensing
- 12 shall carry out the provisions of this title relating to the licensing
- 13 of vehicles and the issuance of vehicle license number plates under the
- 14 direction and supervision of the director and may with the approval of
- 15 the director appoint assistants as special deputies and subagents to
- 16 accept applications and collect fees for vehicle licenses and transfers
- 17 and to deliver vehicle license number plates.
- 18 (2) At any time any application is made to the director, the county
- 19 auditor, or other agent pursuant to any law dealing with licenses,
- 20 registration, or the right to operate any vehicle upon the public
- 21 highways of this state, excluding applicants already paying such fee
- 22 under RCW 46.16.070 or 46.16.085, the applicant shall pay to the
- 23 director, county auditor, or other agent a fee of two dollars for each
- 24 application in addition to any other fees required by law. Applicants
- 25 for certificates of ownership, including applicants paying fees under
- 26 RCW 46.16.070 or 46.16.085, shall pay to the director, county auditor,
- 27 or other agent a fee of three dollars in addition to any other fees
- 28 required by law. These ((additional)) fees, if paid to the county
- 29 auditor as agent of the director, or if paid to ((an agent)) a subagent

- 1 of the county auditor, shall be paid to the county treasurer in the
- 2 same manner as other fees collected by the county auditor and credited
- 3 to the county current expense fund. If the fee is paid to another
- 4 agent of the director, the fee shall be used by the agent to defray his
- 5 or her expenses in handling the application((: PROVIDED, That an agent
- 6 of the county auditor)).
- 7 (3) A subagent is entitled to an additional service charge of two
- 8 dollars. However, from July 1, 1991, through June 30, 1992, subagents
- 9 shall collect a service fee of (a) five dollars and fifty cents for
- 10 changes in a certificate of ownership, with or without registration
- 11 renewal, or verification of record and preparation of an affidavit of
- 12 <u>lost title other than at the time of title application or transfer and</u>
- 13 (b) two dollars and twenty-five cents for registration renewal only,
- 14 issuing a transit permit, or any other service under this section.
- 15 $((\frac{3}{3}))$ (4) If the fee is collected by the state patrol as agent
- 16 for the director, the fee so collected shall be certified to the state
- 17 treasurer and deposited to the credit of the state patrol highway
- 18 account. If the fee is collected by the department of transportation
- 19 as agent for the director, the fee shall be certified to the state
- 20 treasurer and deposited to the credit of the motor vehicle fund. All
- 21 such fees collected by the director or branches of his or her office
- 22 shall be certified to the state treasurer and deposited to the credit
- 23 of the highway safety fund.
- 24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 46.01 RCW
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 By March 1st of each odd-numbered year, each county auditor and all
- 27 persons appointed by the director as an agent or subagent under RCW
- 28 46.01.130 shall report to the director all costs and revenues
- 29 associated with vehicle title and registration activities for the

- 1 previous two calendar years. Each county auditor shall also report the
- 2 total number of licensing subagents and the appointments made during
- 3 the reporting period. Reports must be made on standard forms provided
- 4 by the director for that purpose. The director shall revoke the
- 5 appointment of a person who fails to file the report by March 15th.
- 6 The director shall compile the reports and submit them to the
- 7 legislative transportation committee by April 1st. The director's
- 8 report shall include the total costs and revenues of each county
- 9 auditor and of all subagents within each county, the number of
- 10 subagents within each county, and appointments and revocations made
- 11 during the two-year period.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 "County auditor" includes, in charter counties, the office
- 15 designated to issue motor vehicle licenses.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The director of licensing shall review
- 17 the costs and revenues of all vehicle licensing agents and subagents
- 18 and the benefits provided to the communities they serve and submit a
- 19 report by January 15, 1992, to the legislative transportation committee
- 20 including the following:
- 21 (1) Criteria for determining the costs and benefits of title and
- 22 registration activities by agents and subagents;
- 23 (2) A review of the rate structure for agents and subagents;
- 24 (3) A review of other fee structures for counties and subagents;
- 25 (4) An estimate of the costs of providing each individual title and
- 26 registration function;

- 1 (5) Consideration of the need for cost allocations, such as a
- 2 revolving fund or other mechanisms for funding an automated licensing
- 3 system;
- 4 (6) Consideration of the County Auditors' Automation Program (CAAP)
- 5 system and other changes in methods of providing title and registration
- 6 services since adoption of the current method of compensating agents
- 7 and subagents;
- 8 (7) Recommendations for a process to allow counties to recover
- 9 their full costs of vehicle title and registration activities without
- 10 increasing costs to consumers;
- 11 (8) Recommendations for one standard contract to be used by the
- 12 director of licensing for county auditor agents and one standard
- 13 contract for subagents, with provisions in each requiring disclosure of
- 14 all costs and revenues to the director, but protecting the
- 15 confidentiality of this information;
- 16 (9) An examination of alternative methods of providing title and
- 17 registration services.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 20 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 21 effect July 1, 1991.
