## SENATE BILL 5780

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time February 20, 1991. Referred to Committee on Health & Long-Term Care.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to enhancement of employment transition programs
- 2 for developmentally disabled high school students; adding a new section
- 3 to chapter 71A.12 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.20A RCW;
- 4 adding a new section to chapter 28A.155 RCW; making appropriations;
- 5 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 71A.12 RCW
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 The legislature recognizes that developmentally disabled citizens
- 10 are active, involved, and contributing community members. The
- 11 legislature finds that scarce resources limit the state's ability to
- 12 meet the needs of all unserved developmentally disabled citizens. Due
- 13 to this limited resource availability, developmentally disabled high
- 14 school graduates and other adults are often placed on a waiting list
- 15 for residential services, employment services, or other appropriate day

- 1 programs. Waiting lists cause developmentally disabled high school
- 2 graduates and other adults to experience a deterioration in life and
- 3 work skills. The legislature declares that current waiting lists limit
- 4 the unserved developmentally disabled citizen's immense potential for
- 5 contribution to their community.
- 6 Effective July 1, 1991, the legislature intends to expand services
- 7 to developmentally disabled secondary school graduates within available
- 8 resources.
- 9 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.20A RCW
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 The secretary shall establish a regional disabilities employment
- 12 function that shall provide services to promote and enhance effective
- 13 transition from educational or treatment programs to employment for
- 14 persons with functional limitations, including mental illness,
- 15 developmental disabilities, traumatic brain injuries, and other chronic
- 16 impairments. The regional disabilities employment function shall also
- 17 enhance the use of alternative resources such as social security work
- 18 incentives and natural supports and promote competitive, integrated
- 19 employment opportunities in both the public and private sector.
- The regional disabilities employment function shall: (1) Develop
- 21 a package of incentives, offered by application to interested local
- 22 school districts, that enhance the disabled student's transition from
- 23 school to work. The incentives may include, but are not limited to,
- 24 technical assistance and training for teachers or staff, curriculum
- 25 development, and other measures necessary to promote flexible teaching
- 26 and educational practices that support the transition to integrated,
- 27 competitive, and continuing employment; and (2) collaborate with
- 28 businesses, government agencies, local schools, postsecondary
- 29 educational institutions, regional support networks, developmental

- 1 disabilities boards, or other relevant county authorities to develop
- 2 and encourage collaborative community linkages and partnerships that
- 3 create placement opportunities, provide mentors and prepare
- 4 functionally disabled citizens for the transition from school or
- 5 treatment programs to work.
- 6 The secretary shall contract for this function on a competitive
- 7 basis with existing community organizations such as individuals, firms,
- 8 nonprofit organizations, county authorities, or other programs
- 9 demonstrating proven expertise in supported employment and a
- 10 willingness to collaborate with county authorities, regional support
- 11 networks, schools, and other involved parties.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.155
- 13 RCW to read as follows:
- 14 An appropriate educational program for all handicapped students age
- 15 fifteen or older shall include the development of life and vocational
- 16 skills necessary to achieve appropriate involvement in employment
- 17 and/or community opportunities. The parent or guardian shall be
- 18 involved in the selection of appropriate employment and vocational
- 19 opportunities.
- The school, at the direction of the parent or guardian, shall
- 21 provide an amount equivalent to the portion of state funds generated by
- 22 the average handicapped student for the purposes of financing and
- 23 contracting with parents and the regional disabilities employment
- 24 function contractor pursuant to section 2 of this act to secure
- 25 appropriate employment and/or community opportunities for handicapped
- 26 students outside of the school setting.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sum of two million four hundred
- 28 thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is

- 1 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general
- 2 fund to the department of social and health services for the purposes
- 3 of contracting for the regional disabilities employment function.
- 4 Regional disabilities employment contractors shall place equal emphasis
- 5 on the development of incentive packages for local school districts and
- 6 building community partnerships and connections pursuant to section 2
- 7 of this act.
- 8 The sum of ..... dollars as appropriated in the budget act,
- 9 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the
- 10 biennium ending June 30, 1993, for the purposes of providing supported
- 11 employment placement, training, and ongoing support services to at
- 12 least five hundred sixty developmentally or functionally disabled
- 13 citizens transitioning from educational or treatment programs.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 15 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 16 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 17 effect July 1, 1991.
