- 1 AN ACT Relating to a nonvoting physician assistant member of the
- 2 medical disciplinary board; and amending RCW 18.72.040 and 18.72.050.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 18.72.040 and 1986 c 300 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 There is hereby created the "Washington state medical disciplinary
- 7 board," which shall be composed of one holder of a valid license to
- 8 practice medicine and surgery from each congressional district now
- 9 existing or hereafter created in the state ((and)), three members of
- 10 the public who meet the qualifications contained in RCW 70.39.020(2),
- 11 and one nonvoting member who is a physician assistant authorized to
- 12 practice under chapter 18.71A RCW. The public members and the
- 13 physician assistant member shall be appointed by the governor. The
- 14 public members' term shall be for four years. In order to achieve
- 15 staggered terms, the public member serving on the board on June 11,

- 1 1986, shall continue to serve until October 1, 1987. The remaining two
- 2 public members shall be appointed to initial terms of three years and
- 3 four years, respectively.
- 4 The board shall be an administrative agency of the state of
- 5 Washington. The attorney general shall be the advisor of the board and
- 6 shall represent it in all legal proceedings.
- 7 Sec. 2. RCW 18.72.050 and 1982 1st ex.s. c 30 s 3 are each amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Members of the board, except the public member and the physician
- 10 <u>assistant member</u>, shall be elected by secret mail ballot by the holders
- 11 of licenses to practice medicine and surgery residing in each
- 12 congressional district, now or hereafter existing in the state, and
- 13 shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified.
- 14 Members from even-numbered congressional districts shall be elected in
- 15 even-numbered years and members from odd-numbered congressional
- 16 districts shall be elected in odd-numbered years. The board shall not
- 17 be deemed unlawfully constituted and a member of the board shall not be
- 18 deemed ineligible to serve the remainder of the member's unexpired term
- 19 on the board solely by reason of the establishment of new or revised
- 20 boundaries for congressional districts.
