SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5846

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Senate Committee on Environment & Natural Resources (originally sponsored by Senator Roach).

Read first time March 6, 1991.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to a sludge study task force; adding new sections
- 2 to chapter 90.48 RCW; creating new sections; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) Public concerns are increasing about the expanded use and
- 7 disposal of municipal sewage sludge. The results of a citizens' sludge
- 8 "summit" meeting in June 1990 said the greatest need is to find and
- 9 explore alternatives to current sludge uses.
- 10 (2) The current primary use of sludge in the state is land
- 11 application on agricultural and forest lands. Public concerns are
- 12 focused on the health issues based upon potential impacts on surface
- 13 and ground water quality from land application. New federal technical
- 14 standards to protect public health and the environment are due in
- 15 January 1992.

- 1 (3) Alternatives to current uses of conventionally treated
- 2 municipal sludge should be studied in order to broaden the options for
- 3 the use and management of this resource.
- 4 (4) A pilot project to field test the study's findings is needed.
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A ten-member sludge task force is formed
- 6 to study alternatives to land application or disposal of conventionally
- 7 treated municipal sludge. The task force shall:
- 8 (1) Conduct a literature search to review current and proposed
- 9 alternative sludge treatment and end-use technologies, including but
- 10 not be limited to:
- 11 (a) Glassification;
- 12 (b) Incineration;
- 13 (c) Sterilization;
- 14 (d) Chemical stabilization; and
- 15 (e) Composting;
- 16 (2) Develop a list of commercially available end-use products
- 17 containing recycled sludge or treatment residues from these alternative
- 18 technologies, or both, to include, but not be limited to:
- 19 (a) Building materials;
- 20 (b) Soil enrichment;
- 21 (c) Land cover; and
- 22 (d) Paving materials.
- 23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) The sludge task force shall consist
- 24 of:
- 25 (a) An equal number of representatives from generators/applicators,
- 26 environmentalists/regulators and timber/agriculture from each of the
- 27 following agencies or organizations, selected by their respective
- 28 secretaries or chairpersons: Department of ecology, department of

- 1 health, department of natural resources, Puget Sound water quality
- 2 authority, association of Washington cities, Washington association of
- 3 counties, regional sludge management committee, and the Washington
- 4 state association of sewer districts; and
- 5 (b) Two public members representing the environmental community,
- 6 selected by the chairpersons of the appropriate legislative committees.
- 7 The chair will be elected from among the task force members.
- 8 (2) The department of ecology shall provide administrative support
- 9 to the sludge task force and consult with a member of the scientific
- 10 community knowledgeable on sludge management.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sludge task force shall report its
- 12 findings to the legislature on or before July 1, 1992.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) The department shall issue a
- 14 centennial clean water act grant to fund a pilot project on the task
- 15 force's selected priority use alternative or alternatives. The pilot
- 16 project is to be completed by December 1, 1993.
- 17 (2) The department shall submit a report by July 1, 1994, to the
- 18 appropriate legislative committees of the pilot project findings, to
- 19 include, but not be limited to:
- 20 (a) Health impacts;
- 21 (b) Recyclability;
- 22 (c) Economic feasibility;
- 23 (d) Disposal and use options; and
- (e) Comparative handling costs.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The sum of dollars, or as
- 26 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 27 ending June 30, 1993, from the centennial clean water fund to the

- 1 department of ecology for the purposes of sections 2 through 4 of this
- 2 act.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are
- 4 each added to chapter 90.48 RCW.
