- 1 AN ACT Relating to the effects of electric and magnetic fields;
- 2 amending RCW 82.16.052; adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW;
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 54.16 RCW; adding new sections to
- 4 chapter 80.28 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that electricity
- 7 is an indispensable part of modern living and contributes to the
- 8 health, safety, and happiness of our society. The legislature further
- 9 finds that a great amount of information is needed before the effects
- 10 of electric and magnetic fields can be definitively determined, and
- 11 that customers of electric utilities need additional information on the
- 12 characteristics and prevalence of this form of nonionizing radiation.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:

- 1 By January 1, 1992, any city or town distributing electric energy
- 2 shall by general ordinance enact a program to inform customers of the
- 3 nature and presence of electric and magnetic fields. The program shall
- 4 include, but not be limited to, the following elements:
- 5 (1) Public information, including the distribution of billing
- 6 inserts that describe the characteristics of electric and magnetic
- 7 fields, the extent to which information is known and unknown about
- 8 effects from electric and magnetic fields, a brief explanation of
- 9 ongoing research into electric and magnetic fields, and ways customers
- 10 may obtain additional information on electric and magnetic fields.
- 11 (2) A one-time inspection of residential units, if requested by a
- 12 customer, provided on a waiting list basis, for the purpose of
- 13 determining the amount of residential exposure to electric and magnetic
- 14 fields; or information about how a customer may obtain residential
- 15 electric and magnetic field measurements through entities providing
- 16 such services or measuring devices.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 54.16 RCW
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 By January 1, 1992, any district distributing electric energy shall
- 20 by resolution enact a program to inform customers of the nature and
- 21 presence of electric and magnetic fields. The program shall include,
- 22 but not be limited to, the following elements:
- 23 (1) Public information, including the distribution of billing
- 24 inserts that describe the characteristics of electric and magnetic
- 25 fields, the extent to which information is known and unknown about
- 26 effects from electric and magnetic fields, a brief explanation of
- 27 ongoing research into electric and magnetic fields, and ways customers
- 28 may obtain additional information on electric and magnetic fields.

- 1 (2) A one-time inspection of residential units, if requested by a
- 2 customer, provided on a waiting list basis, for the purpose of
- 3 determining the amount of residential exposure to electric and magnetic
- 4 fields; or information about how a customer may obtain residential

- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 80.28 RCW
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 By January 1, 1992, each electrical company shall institute a
- 10 program to inform customers of the nature and presence of electric and
- 11 magnetic fields. The program shall include, but not be limited to, the
- 12 following elements:
- 13 (1) Public information, including the distribution of billing
- 14 inserts that describe the characteristics of electric and magnetic
- 15 fields, the extent to which information is known and unknown about
- 16 effects from electric and magnetic fields, a brief explanation of
- 17 ongoing research into electric and magnetic fields, and ways customers
- 18 may obtain additional information on electric and magnetic fields.
- 19 (2) A one-time inspection of residential units, if requested by a
- 20 customer, provided on a waiting list basis, for the purpose of
- 21 determining the amount of residential exposure to electric and magnetic
- 22 fields; or information about how a customer may obtain residential
- 23 electric and magnetic field measurements through entities providing
- 24 such services or measuring devices.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 80.28 RCW
- 26 to read as follows:

- 1 The commission shall provide an appropriate regulatory mechanism
- 2 that allows an electrical company regulated by the commission to
- 3 recover expenses incurred by the company under section 4 of this act.
- 4 Sec. 6. RCW 82.16.052 and 1990 c 2 s 10 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) In computing tax under this chapter there shall be deducted
- 7 from the gross income:
- 8 (a) Payments made under RCW 19.27A.035; ((and))
- 9 (b) Those amounts expended on additional programs that improve the
- 10 efficiency of energy end use if priority is given to senior citizens
- 11 and low-income citizens in the course of carrying out such programs:
- 12 and
- 13 (c) Costs incurred under sections 2, 3, and 4 of this act.
- 14 (2) The department, after consultation with the utilities and
- 15 transportation commission in the case of investor-owned utilities and
- 16 the governing bodies of locally regulated utilities, shall determine
- 17 the eligibility of individual programs for deductions under this
- 18 section.
- 19 (3) Until July 1, 1992, utilities may deduct from the amount of tax
- 20 paid under this chapter fifty percent of the payments made under RCW
- 21 19.27A.055, excluding any federal funds that are passed through to a
- 22 utility for the purpose of retraining local code officials.
- 23 (4) This section shall expire January 1, 1996.
