- 1 AN ACT Relating to elections by mail for school district bonds and
- 2 levies; and amending RCW 29.36.120.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 29.36.120 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 71 s 1 are each amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 At any primary or election, general or special, the county auditor
- 7 may, in any precinct having fewer than one hundred registered voters at
- 8 the time of closing of voter registration as provided in RCW 29.07.160,
- 9 conduct the voting in that precinct by mail ballot. For any precinct
- 10 having fewer than one hundred registered voters where voting at a
- 11 primary or a general election is conducted by mail ballot, the county
- 12 auditor shall, not less than fifteen days prior to the date of that
- 13 primary or general election, mail or deliver to each registered voter
- 14 within that precinct a notice that the voting in that precinct will be

- 1 by mail ballot, an application form for a mail ballot, and a postage
- 2 prepaid envelope, preaddressed to the issuing officer. A mail ballot
- 3 shall be issued to each voter who returns a properly executed
- 4 application to the county auditor no later than the day of that primary
- 5 or general election. Such application is valid for all subsequent mail
- 6 ballot elections in that precinct so long as the voter remains
- 7 qualified to vote. However, the county auditor shall not deny the
- 8 request of a school district that an election to validate an excess
- 9 levy under RCW 84.52.053 or bond issue under RCW 28A.530.020 be
- 10 conducted by mail ballot.
- 11 At any nonpartisan special election not being held in conjunction
- 12 with a state primary or general election, the county, city, town, or
- 13 district requesting the election pursuant to RCW 29.13.010 or 29.13.020
- 14 may also request that the election be conducted by mail ballot. The
- 15 county auditor may honor the request or may determine that the election
- 16 is not to be conducted by mail ballot. The decision of the county
- 17 auditor in this regard is final.
- 18 In no instance shall any special election be conducted by mail
- 19 ballot in any precinct with more than one hundred registered voters if
- 20 candidates for partisan office are to be voted upon.
- 21 For all special elections not being held in conjunction with a
- 22 state primary or state general election where voting is conducted by
- 23 mail ballot, the county auditor shall, not less than fifteen days prior
- 24 to the date of such election, mail or deliver to each registered voter
- 25 a mail ballot and an envelope, preaddressed to the issuing officer.
