## SENATE BILL 5897

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Senators Conner, Niemi, Rasmussen and Skratek.

Read first time March 1, 1991. Referred to Committee on Health & Long-Term Care.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to denturitry; amending RCW 18.130.040; adding a
- 2 new chapter to Title 18 RCW; creating a new section; prescribing
- 3 penalties; making an appropriation; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds it necessary to
- 6 regulate the practice of denturitry at the level of certification in
- 7 order to protect the public health and safety and to establish an
- 8 alternate means of denture delivery. It is the intent of the
- 9 legislature that only individuals who meet and maintain minimum
- 10 standards of competence and conduct provide service to the public.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) Certification under this chapter is
- 12 required in the practice of denturitry to perform the following acts:
- 13 (a) Engaging in or offering to engage in the practice of
- 14 denturitry; or

- 1 (b) Using the word "denturist," "certified denturist," "CD," or
- 2 other words, letters, abbreviations, or insignia in connection with a
- 3 name, implying that the person is engaged in the practice of
- 4 denturitry.
- 5 (2) Violation of this section shall constitute a gross misdemeanor.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 7 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 8 chapter.
- 9 (1) "Board" means the board of denturitry.
- 10 (2) "Complete denture" means a removable prosthetic dental
- 11 appliance worn on the human edentulous arch.
- 12 (3) "Denturitry" means the practice of a denturist and is the
- 13 making, fitting, altering, or repairing of a denture for a patient
- 14 directly, and includes the taking of impressions, bite registrations,
- 15 or inner arch relations, trying of dentures set in wax, and final
- 16 seating and adjustment of dentures.
- 17 (4) "Department" means the department of health.
- 18 (5) "Immediate denture" means a denture that is fabricated prior to
- 19 and inserted in the human oral cavity immediately after the extraction
- 20 of natural teeth.
- 21 (6) "Partial denture" means a removable dental appliance that is
- 22 attached to natural teeth for the purpose of replacing missing teeth on
- 23 a partial edentulous arch.
- 24 (7) "Public member" means an individual who is not, and never has
- 25 been a member or spouse of a member of a health profession currently
- 26 regulated, or an individual who does not have and has never had a
- 27 material financial interest in the rendering of denturitry or an
- 28 activity directly related to denturitry.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) Immediate dentures may be fabricated
- 2 for a patient by a denturist on the written prescription and under the
- 3 general supervision of a dentist. The dentist is responsible for the
- 4 extraction of the natural teeth, inserting the immediate dentures, and
- 5 the aftercare of the patient; however, the treating dentist may
- 6 delegate portions of patient treatment, to a denturist, that fall under
- 7 a denturist's scope of practice.
- 8 (2) Replacement dentures may be fabricated for the patient, by a
- 9 denturist without the supervision of a dentist, six months from the
- 10 date of the extractions.
- 11 (3) Partial dentures may be fabricated for a patient directly only
- 12 on the written prescription of a dentist.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A denturist certified under this chapter
- 14 shall not:
- 15 (1) Extract or attempt to extract natural teeth;
- 16 (2) Surgically modify or attempt to surgically modify natural teeth
- 17 or tissue;
- 18 (3) Recommend prescription drugs for oral or medical diseases;
- 19 (4) Fit orthodontic appliances; or
- 20 (5) Fabricate a partial denture or immediate complete denture, for
- 21 a patient directly, without a prescription from a dentist.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Nothing in this chapter shall be
- 23 construed to prohibit or restrict persons authorized by the state of
- 24 Washington to practice medicine or dentistry, persons authorized in
- 25 writing by a dentist to perform nonclinical dental laboratory
- 26 procedures, or a person from practicing the profession the person is
- 27 authorized to practice.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** (1) In addition to authority provided by
- 2 law, the department shall have the following authority to:
- 3 (a) Adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter;
- 4 (b) Set certification and renewal fees;
- 5 (c) Establish forms and procedures necessary to implement this
- 6 chapter;
- 7 (d) Issue a certificate to an applicant that has met the education,
- 8 training, examination, and conduct requirements; and
- 9 (e) Hire clerical, administrative, and investigative staff as
- 10 needed to implement this chapter.
- 11 (2) The uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs the
- 12 issuance and denial of certification and the discipline of certificate
- 13 holders under this chapter. The department is the disciplining
- 14 authority under this chapter.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** The department shall keep an official
- 16 record of all proceedings. A part of the record shall consist of a
- 17 register of all applicants for certification under this chapter.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** (1) The board of denturitry is hereby
- 19 created consisting of five members appointed by the governor.
- 20 (a) Two members shall be public members, not associated with a
- 21 health profession;
- 22 (b) Two members shall be denturists. Prior to the certification of
- 23 a denturist under this chapter, two denturist applicants shall be
- 24 conditional members. If a conditional member should fail to pass a
- 25 portion of the written or practical examination he or she shall be
- 26 dismissed; and
- 27 (c) One member shall be a dentist with a minimum of six years'
- 28 experience in the practice of dentistry.

- 1 (2) A member's term of office is three years at the pleasure of the
- 2 governor. The governor, before expiration of the term of a member,
- 3 shall appoint a successor whose term begins on July 1. The terms of
- 4 the first members shall be staggered to ensure an orderly succession of
- 5 new members. A member is eligible for reappointment, but no member
- 6 shall serve more than two consecutive terms, unless the governor
- 7 determines good cause. If a vacancy arises, the governor shall make an
- 8 appointment, effective immediately, for the unexpired term.
- 9 (3) Members shall be reimbursed for expenses in accordance with
- 10 state statutes.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** Members of the board or individuals
- 12 acting on their behalf are immune from civil suit in an action based on
- 13 certification or disciplinary proceedings or other official acts
- 14 performed in the course of duty.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 11.** (1) Examinations shall determine the
- 16 qualifications, fitness, and ability of the applicants to practice
- 17 denturitry under this chapter. The form of the examination shall
- 18 include a written and a practical demonstration of skills.
- 19 (2) The board shall conduct examinations at least annually if there
- 20 are applicants. The written and practical examinations shall carry
- 21 equal weight and the passing score is determined by agreement of the
- 22 board members.
- 23 (3) Applicants who fail to score a passing grade on the written or
- 24 practical examination, or both, may upon payment of the appropriate
- 25 fee, have another opportunity to take the entire exam, or the written
- 26 or practical portion only. The board may approve successive
- 27 examinations upon application and payment of the prescribed fee.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** It is recognized that the scope of
- 2 practice of denturists overlaps in some areas with the scope of
- 3 practice of dentists, licensed under chapter 18.32 RCW. Denturists
- 4 certified and practicing under this chapter are exempted from chapter
- 5 18.32 RCW when acting within their scope of practice.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** Upon application, payment of the
- 7 appropriate fee, and successful completion of the board examination,
- 8 the department shall issue a certificate to practice denturitry, that
- 9 is valid for two years. Prior to taking the board examination
- 10 applicants shall complete the following criteria:
- 11 (1) Graduation from two years of formal study at an approved
- 12 college of denturitry that is recognized by the board; or
- 13 (2) Evidence of seven years of experience in the vocation of dental
- 14 technology, that shall include four thousand hours in the fabrication
- 15 of complete dentures, or complete and partial dentures. Two of the
- 16 required seven years may be in a school of dental laboratory
- 17 technology; and
- 18 (3) Completion of the following educational requirements which
- 19 shall include but are not limited to:
- 20 (a) Embryology ten hours;
- 21 (b) Oral pathology one hundred forty hours;
- 22 (c) Head and neck anatomy sixty hours;
- 23 (d) Physiology thirty hours;
- 24 (e) Histology ten hours;
- 25 (f) Clinical denturitry sixty hours;
- 26 (q) Periodontology twenty hours;
- 27 (h) Oral radiographic diagnosis thirty hours;
- (i) Interpretation of medical five hours;
- 29 laboratory values

- 1 (j) Dental materials five hours;
- 2 (k) HIV/AIDS, and asepsis ten hours; and
- 3 (1) Microbiology five hours.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 14.** Notwithstanding a provision of an
- 5 insurance policy covering dental health, or a state agency that pays
- 6 dental services, if an insurance policy provides for a service that is
- 7 within the lawful scope of practice of this chapter, the insured
- 8 patient under the policy is entitled to reimbursement for the service,
- 9 or payment directly to the denturist or dentist provider.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 15.** Consumer protection laws that apply to
- 11 dentists shall apply to denturists.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 16.** A denturist may enter into a lawful
- 13 agreement with a dentist regarding fees, compensation, business
- 14 associations, and professional corporations.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 17.** Applications for certification shall be
- 16 submitted on forms provided by the department. The department may
- 17 require information and documentation that reasonably relates to making
- 18 a determination that the applicant meets the criteria. Each applicant
- 19 shall pay a fee determined by the department, that shall accompany the
- 20 application.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 18.** The department shall establish by rule
- 22 the procedural requirements for the renewal of certificates. Failure
- 23 to renew shall invalidate the certificate and all privileges granted by
- 24 the certificate.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 19.** This chapter may be known and cited as
- 2 the denturist certification act.
- 3 Sec. 20. RCW 18.130.040 and 1990 c 3 s 810 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) This chapter applies only to the secretary and the boards
- 6 having jurisdiction in relation to the professions licensed under the
- 7 chapters specified in this section. This chapter does not apply to any
- 8 business or profession not licensed under the chapters specified in
- 9 this section.
- 10 (2) (a) The secretary has authority under this chapter in relation
- 11 to the following professions:
- 12 (i) Dispensing opticians licensed under chapter 18.34 RCW;
- (ii) Naturopaths licensed under chapter 18.36A RCW;
- 14 (iii) Midwives licensed under chapter 18.50 RCW;
- 15 (iv) Ocularists licensed under chapter 18.55 RCW;
- 16 (v) Massage operators and businesses licensed under chapter 18.108
- 17 RCW;
- 18 (vi) Dental hygienists licensed under chapter 18.29 RCW;
- 19 (vii) Acupuncturists certified under chapter 18.06 RCW;
- 20 (viii) Radiologic technologists certified under chapter 18.84 RCW;
- 21 (ix) Respiratory care practitioners certified under chapter 18.89
- 22 RCW;
- 23 (x) Persons registered or certified under chapter 18.19 RCW;
- 24 (xi) Persons registered as nursing pool operators;
- 25 (xii) Nursing assistants registered or certified under chapter
- 26 18.52B RCW;
- 27 (xiii) Dietitians and nutritionists certified under chapter 18.138
- 28 RCW; ((<del>and</del>))

- 1 (xiv) Sex offender treatment providers certified under chapter
- 2 18.155 RCW; and
- 3 (xv) Denturists certified under chapter 18.-- RCW (sections 1
- 4 through 18 of this act).
- 5 (b) The boards having authority under this chapter are as follows:
- 6 (i) The ((podiatry)) podiatric medical board as established in
- 7 chapter 18.22 RCW;
- 8 (ii) The chiropractic disciplinary board as established in chapter
- 9 18.26 RCW governing licenses issued under chapter 18.25 RCW;
- 10 (iii) The dental disciplinary board as established in chapter 18.32
- 11 RCW;
- 12 (iv) The council on hearing aids as established in chapter 18.35
- 13 RCW;
- 14 (v) The board of funeral directors and embalmers as established in
- 15 chapter 18.39 RCW;
- 16 (vi) The board of examiners for nursing home administrators as
- 17 established in chapter 18.52 RCW;
- 18 (vii) The optometry board as established in chapter 18.54 RCW
- 19 governing licenses issued under chapter 18.53 RCW;
- 20 (viii) The board of osteopathic medicine and surgery as established
- 21 in chapter 18.57 RCW governing licenses issued under chapters 18.57 and
- 22 18.57A RCW;
- 23 (ix) The medical disciplinary board as established in chapter 18.72
- 24 RCW governing licenses and registrations issued under chapters 18.71
- 25 and 18.71A RCW;
- 26 (x) The board of physical therapy as established in chapter 18.74
- 27 RCW;
- 28 (xi) The board of occupational therapy practice as established in
- 29 chapter 18.59 RCW;

- 1 (xii) The board of practical nursing as established in chapter
- 2 18.78 RCW;
- 3 (xiii) The examining board of psychology and its disciplinary
- 4 committee as established in chapter 18.83 RCW;
- 5 (xiv) The board of nursing as established in chapter 18.88 RCW; and
- 6 (xv) The veterinary board of governors as established in chapter
- 7 18.92 RCW.
- 8 (3) In addition to the authority to discipline license holders, the
- 9 disciplining authority has the authority to grant or deny licenses
- 10 based on the conditions and criteria established in this chapter and
- 11 the chapters specified in subsection (2) of this section. However, the
- 12 board of chiropractic examiners has authority over issuance and denial
- 13 of licenses provided for in chapter 18.25 RCW, the board of dental
- 14 examiners has authority over issuance and denial of licenses provided
- 15 for in RCW 18.32.040, and the board of medical examiners has authority
- 16 over issuance and denial of licenses and registrations provided for in
- 17 chapters 18.71 and 18.71A RCW. This chapter also governs any
- 18 investigation, hearing, or proceeding relating to denial of licensure
- 19 or issuance of a license conditioned on the applicant's compliance with
- 20 an order entered pursuant to RCW 18.130.160 by the disciplining
- 21 authority.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 21.** Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall
- 23 constitute a new chapter in Title 18 RCW.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 22.** If any provision of this act or its
- 25 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 26 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 27 persons or circumstances is not affected.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 23.** This act shall take effect January 1,
- 2 1992.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 24.** The sum of ........... dollars, or as
- 4 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 5 ending June 30, 1993, from the health professions account to the
- 6 department of health for the purposes of this act.
