- 1 AN ACT Relating to providing urban property owners the option of
- 2 notifying persons of a pesticide application; amending RCW 17.21.020;
- 3 and adding a new section to chapter 17.21 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 17.21.020 and 1989 c 380 s 33 are each amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
- 8 this section apply throughout this chapter.
- 9 (1) "Agricultural commodity" means any plant or part of a plant, or
- 10 animal, or animal product, produced by a person (including farmers,
- 11 ranchers, vineyardists, plant propagators, Christmas tree growers,
- 12 aquaculturists, floriculturists, orchardists, foresters, or other
- 13 comparable persons) primarily for sale, consumption, propagation, or
- 14 other use by people or animals.

- 1 (2) "Apparatus" means any type of ground, water, or aerial
- 2 equipment, device, or contrivance using motorized, mechanical, or
- 3 pressurized power and used to apply any pesticide on land and anything
- 4 that may be growing, habitating, or stored on or in such land, but
- 5 shall not include any pressurized handsized household device used to
- 6 apply any pesticide, or any equipment, device, or contrivance of which
- 7 the person who is applying the pesticide is the source of power or
- 8 energy in making such pesticide application, or any other small
- 9 equipment, device, or contrivance that is transported in a piece of
- 10 equipment licensed under this chapter as an apparatus.
- 11 (3) "Arthropod" means any invertebrate animal that belongs to the
- 12 phylum arthropoda, which in addition to insects, includes allied
- 13 classes whose members are wingless and usually have more than six legs;
- 14 for example, spiders, mites, ticks, centipedes, and isopod crustaceans.
- 15 (4) "Certified applicator" means any individual who is licensed as
- 16 a commercial pesticide applicator, commercial pesticide operator,
- 17 public operator, private-commercial applicator, demonstration and
- 18 research applicator, or certified private applicator, or any other
- 19 individual who is certified by the director to use or supervise the use
- 20 of any pesticide which is classified by the EPA as a restricted use
- 21 pesticide or by the state as restricted to use by certified applicators
- 22 only.
- 23 (5) "Commercial pesticide applicator" means any person who engages
- 24 in the business of applying pesticides to the land of another.
- 25 (6) "Commercial pesticide operator" means any employee of a
- 26 commercial pesticide applicator who uses or supervises the use of any
- 27 pesticide and who is required to be licensed under provisions of this
- 28 chapter.

- 1 (7) "Defoliant" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 2 intended to cause the leaves or foliage to drop from a plant with or
- 3 without causing abscission.
- 4 (8) "Department" means the Washington state department of
- 5 agriculture.
- 6 (9) "Desiccant" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 7 intended to artificially accelerate the drying of plant tissues.
- 8 (10) "Device" means any instrument or contrivance intended to trap,
- 9 destroy, control, repel, or mitigate pests, or to destroy, control,
- 10 repel, or mitigate fungi, nematodes, or such other pests, as may be
- 11 designated by the director, but not including equipment used for the
- 12 application of pesticides when sold separately from the pesticides.
- 13 (11) "Direct supervision" by certified private applicators shall
- 14 mean that the designated restricted use pesticide shall be applied for
- 15 purposes of producing any agricultural commodity on land owned or
- 16 rented by the applicator or the applicator's employer, by a competent
- 17 person acting under the instructions and control of a certified private
- 18 applicator who is available if and when needed, even though such
- 19 certified private applicator is not physically present at the time and
- 20 place the pesticide is applied. The certified private applicator shall
- 21 have direct management responsibility and familiarity of the pesticide,
- 22 manner of application, pest, and land to which the pesticide is being
- 23 applied. Direct supervision by all other certified applicators means
- 24 direct on-the-job supervision. Direct supervision of an aerial
- 25 apparatus means the pilot of the aircraft must be appropriately
- 26 certified.
- 27 (12) "Director" means the director of the department or a duly
- 28 authorized representative.
- 29 (13) "Engage in business" means any application of pesticides by
- 30 any person upon lands or crops of another.

- 1 (14) "EPA" means the United States environmental protection agency.
- 2 (15) "EPA restricted use pesticide" means any pesticide with
- 3 restricted uses as classified for restricted use by the administrator,
- 4 EPA.
- 5 (16) "FIFRA" means the federal insecticide, fungicide and
- 6 rodenticide act as amended (61 Stat. 163, 7 U.S.C. Sec. 136 et seq.).
- 7 (17) "Fungi" means all nonchlorophyll-bearing thallophytes (all
- 8 nonchlorophyll-bearing plants of lower order than mosses and
- 9 liverworts); for example, rusts, smuts, mildews, molds, yeasts, and
- 10 bacteria, except those on or in a living person or other animals.
- 11 (18) "Fungicide" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 12 intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate any fungi.
- 13 (19) "Herbicide" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 14 intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate any weed.
- 15 (20) "Insect" means any of the numerous small invertebrate animals
- 16 whose bodies are more or less obviously segmented, and which for the
- 17 most part belong to the class insecta, comprising six-legged, usually
- 18 winged forms, as, for example, beetles, bugs, bees, flies, and to other
- 19 allied classes of arthropods whose members are wingless and usually
- 20 have more than six legs, for example, spiders, mites, ticks,
- 21 centipedes, and isopod crustaceans.
- 22 (21) "Insecticide" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 23 intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate any insects which may
- 24 be present in any environment whatsoever.
- 25 (22) "Land" means all land and water areas, including airspace and
- 26 all plants, animals, structures, buildings, devices, and contrivances,
- 27 appurtenant to or situated on, fixed or mobile, including any used for
- 28 transportation.
- 29 (23) "Nematocide" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 30 intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate nematodes.

- 1 (24) "Nematode" means any invertebrate animal of the phylum
- 2 nemathelminthes and class nematoda, that is, unsegmented round worms
- 3 with elongated, fusiform, or saclike bodies covered with cuticle, and
- 4 inhabiting soil, water, plants or plant parts, may also be called nemas
- 5 or eelworms.
- 6 (25) "Person" means any individual, partnership, association,
- 7 corporation, or organized group of persons whether or not incorporated.
- 8 (26) "Pest" means, but is not limited to, any insect, rodent,
- 9 nematode, snail, slug, weed, and any form of plant or animal life or
- 10 virus, except virus on or in a living person or other animal, which is
- 11 normally considered to be a pest, or which the director may declare to
- 12 be a pest.
- 13 (27) "Pesticide" means, but is not limited to:
- 14 (a) Any substance or mixture of substances intended to prevent,
- 15 destroy, control, repel, or mitigate any insect, rodent, snail, slug,
- 16 fungus, weed, and any other form of plant or animal life or virus
- 17 except virus on or in a living person or other animal which is normally
- 18 considered to be a pest or which the director may declare to be a pest;
- 19 (b) Any substance or mixture of substances intended to be used as
- 20 a plant regulator, defoliant or desiccant; and
- 21 (c) Any spray adjuvant, such as a wetting agent, spreading agent,
- 22 deposit builder, adhesive, emulsifying agent, deflocculating agent,
- 23 water modifier, or similar agent with or without toxic properties of
- 24 its own intended to be used with any other pesticide as an aid to the
- 25 application or effect thereof, and sold in a package or container
- 26 separate from that of the pesticide with which it is to be used.
- 27 (28) "Pesticide advisory board" means the pesticide advisory board
- 28 as provided for in this chapter.
- 29 (29) "Plant regulator" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 30 intended through physiological action, to accelerate or retard the rate

- 1 of growth or maturation, or to otherwise alter the behavior of
- 2 ornamental or crop plants or their produce, but shall not include
- 3 substances insofar as they are intended to be used as plant nutrients,
- 4 trace elements, nutritional chemicals, plant inoculants, or soil
- 5 amendments.
- 6 (30) "Private applicator" means a certified applicator who uses or
- 7 is in direct supervision of the use of (a) any EPA restricted use
- 8 pesticide; or (b) any restricted use pesticide restricted to use only
- 9 by certified applicators by the director, for the purposes of producing
- 10 any agricultural commodity and for any associated noncrop application
- 11 on land owned or rented by the applicator or the applicator's employer
- 12 or if applied without compensation other than trading of personal
- 13 services between producers of agricultural commodities on the land of
- 14 another person.
- 15 (31) "Private-commercial applicator" means a certified applicator
- 16 who uses or supervises the use of (a) any EPA restricted use pesticide
- 17 or (b) any restricted use pesticide restricted to use only by certified
- 18 applicators for purposes other than the production of any agricultural
- 19 commodity on lands owned or rented by the applicator or the
- 20 applicator's employer.
- 21 (32) "Restricted use pesticide" means any pesticide or device
- 22 which, when used as directed or in accordance with a widespread and
- 23 commonly recognized practice, the director determines, subsequent to a
- 24 hearing, requires additional restrictions for that use to prevent
- 25 unreasonable adverse effects on the environment including people,
- 26 lands, beneficial insects, animals, crops, and wildlife, other than
- 27 pests.
- 28 (33) "Rodenticide" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 29 intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate rodents, or any other
- 30 vertebrate animal which the director may declare by rule to be a pest.

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- 1 (34) "Snails or slugs" include all harmful mollusks.
- 2 (35) "Unreasonable adverse effects on the environment" means any
- 3 unreasonable risk to people or the environment taking into account the
- 4 economic, social, and environmental costs and benefits of the use of
- 5 any pesticide, or as otherwise determined by the director.
- 6 (36) "Weed" means any plant which grows where not wanted.
- 7 (37) "Residential property" includes property less than one acre
- 8 <u>in size zoned as residential by a city, town, or county.</u>
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 17.21 RCW
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (1) When a pesticide is to be applied to public and private school
- 12 grounds, day care centers, parks, playgrounds, or residential property
- 13 by a certified applicator, the certified applicator shall at the option
- 14 of the owner or owner's representative: (a) Post the property; and/or
- 15 (b) make available to the owner or owner's representative a written
- 16 copy of the information, specifically health warnings to humans and
- 17 pets, contained on the label of the pesticide to be applied.
- 18 (2) If the owner or the owner's representative chooses to have the
- 19 property posted for a pesticide application, the certified applicator
- 20 shall provide signs to post the treated area.
- 21 (3) Signs shall be posted at the time of the application and for at
- 22 least the following twenty-four hours. For applications of pesticides
- 23 which have a reentry interval established by the environmental
- 24 protection agency, the applicator shall comply with the label
- 25 requirements. The owner or occupant of the property receiving the
- 26 application is responsible for the removal of the signs after the
- 27 posting period or applicable reentry interval.
- 28 (4) Signs shall include the name and telephone number of the
- 29 applicator of the pesticide.

- 1 (5) The director of the department of agriculture shall adopt rules
- 2 establishing the size and lettering requirements of signs.
- 3 (6) State and local health departments and mosquito control
- 4 districts when conducting mosquito control operations are exempt from
- 5 the posting requirements of this section.
