- 1 AN ACT Relating to feeding school children during teachers' work
- 2 stoppage; creating new sections; making an appropriation; and declaring
- 3 an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that state school
- 6 feeding programs are essential to the health and well-being of many
- 7 children and that continuing these programs during a teachers' work
- 8 stoppage is in the best interests of the state of Washington.
- 9 The legislature intends to continue to provide food to eligible
- 10 children who customarily receive free or reduced meals at their
- 11 schools, using the regular food programs, during the teachers' work
- 12 stoppage, which began on April 18, 1991, in forty-six districts
- 13 throughout the state.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The superintendent of public instruction
- 2 may reimburse school districts with state funds for the amount of any
- 3 unavailable federal share of costs for free or reduced school
- 4 breakfasts or lunches actually provided to children during the
- 5 teachers' work stoppage that began April 18, 1991.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of two million dollars, or as
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 8 ending June 30, 1991, from the general fund to the superintendent of
- 9 public instruction solely to replace federal funding for free and
- 10 reduced school breakfasts and lunches that the state will not receive
- 11 because of the teachers' work stoppage.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 13 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 14 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 15 effect immediately.
