## SENATE BILL 6002

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 1st Special Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to volunteer service; adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 4.24 RCW; creating new sections; and repealing RCW 4.24.264.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds and declares that:
- 5 (1) The willingness of volunteers to offer their services has been
- 6 increasingly deterred by a perception that they put personal assets at
- 7 risk in the event of tort actions seeking damages arising from their
- 8 activities as volunteers;
- 9 (2) The contributions of programs, activities, and services to
- 10 communities is diminished and worthwhile programs, activities, and
- 11 services are deterred by the unwillingness of volunteers to serve
- 12 either as volunteers or as officers, directors, or trustees of
- 13 nonprofit public and private organizations;
- 14 (3) It is in the public interest to strike a balance between the
- 15 right of a person to seek redress for injury and the right of an

- 1 individual to freely give of his or her time and energy without
- 2 compensation as a volunteer in service to his or her community without
- 3 fear of personal liability for acts undertaken in good faith absent
- 4 willful or wanton conduct on the part of the volunteer; and
- 5 (4) This chapter is intended to encourage volunteers to contribute
- 6 their services for the good of their communities and at the same time
- 7 provide a reasonable basis for redress of claims which may arise
- 8 relating to those services.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 10 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout sections 3
- 11 and 4 of this act.
- 12 (1) "Volunteer" is a person performing services for a nonprofit
- 13 organization, a nonprofit corporation, a hospital, or a governmental
- 14 entity without compensation, other than reimbursement for actual
- 15 expenses incurred. The term includes a volunteer serving as a
- 16 director, officer, trustee, or direct service volunteer.
- 17 (2) "Nonprofit organization" is any organization that is exempt
- 18 from taxation pursuant to section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code,
- 19 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c), as amended.
- 20 (3) "Nonprofit corporation" is any corporation that is defined as
- 21 a nonprofit corporation under Title 24 RCW or that is exempt from
- 22 taxation pursuant to section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26
- 23 U.S.C. Sec. 501(a).
- 24 (4) "Governmental entity" is any county, city, town, municipality,
- 25 school district, governmental unit, other special district, similar
- 26 entity, or any association, authority, board, commission, division,
- 27 office, officer, task force, or other agency of the state.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) Any volunteer shall be immune from
- 2 civil liability in any action on the basis of any act or omission of a
- 3 volunteer resulting in damage or injury if:
- 4 (a) The volunteer was acting in good faith and within the scope of
- 5 the volunteer's official functions and duties for a nonprofit
- 6 organization, a nonprofit corporation, hospital, or a governmental
- 7 entity; and
- 8 (b) The damage or injury was not caused by willful and wanton
- 9 misconduct by the volunteer.
- 10 (2) In any suit against a nonprofit organization, nonprofit
- 11 corporation, or a hospital for civil damages based upon the negligent
- 12 act or omission of a volunteer, proof of such act or omission shall be
- 13 sufficient to establish the responsibility of the organization therefor
- 14 under the doctrine of respondeat superior, notwithstanding the immunity
- 15 granted to the volunteer with respect to any act or omission included
- 16 under subsection (1) of this section.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Notwithstanding section 3 of this act,
- 18 a plaintiff may sue and recover civil damages from a volunteer based
- 19 upon a negligent act or omission involving the operation of a motor
- 20 vehicle during an activity, except that the amount recovered from such
- 21 volunteer may not exceed the limits of applicable insurance coverage
- 22 maintained by or on behalf of such volunteer with respect to the
- 23 negligent operation of a motor vehicle in such circumstances.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act applies to all causes of action
- 25 commenced on or after the effective date of this act, regardless of
- 26 when the cause of action may have arisen. To this extent, this act
- 27 applies retroactively, but in all other respects it applies
- 28 prospectively.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** RCW 4.24.264 and 1987 c 212 s 1101 &
- 2 1986 c 305 s 903 are each repealed.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are
- 4 each added to chapter 4.24 RCW.
