- 1 AN ACT Relating to making ample provision for the education of all
- 2 children; and amending RCW 28A.150.210.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.150.210 and 1977 ex.s. c 359 s 2 are each amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The goal of the Basic Education Act for the schools of the
- 7 state of Washington ((set forth in this 1977 amendatory act)) shall be
- 8 to provide students with the opportunity to achieve those skills which
- 9 are generally recognized as requisite to learning. Those skills shall
- 10 include the ability:
- 11  $\left(\left(\frac{1}{1}\right)\right)$  (a) To distinguish, interpret and make use of words,
- 12 numbers and other symbols, including sound, colors, shapes and
- 13 textures;

- 1  $((\frac{2}{2}))$  (b) To organize words and other symbols into acceptable
- 2 verbal and nonverbal forms of expression, and numbers into their
- 3 appropriate functions;
- 4 (((3))) (c) To perform intellectual functions such as problem
- 5 solving, decision making, goal setting, selecting, planning,
- 6 predicting, experimenting, ordering and evaluating; and
- 7  $((\frac{4}{1}))$  (d) To use various muscles necessary for coordinating
- 8 physical and mental functions.
- 9 (2) In order to provide students with the opportunity to achieve
- 10 the skills in subsection (1) of this section, each student should be
- 11 provided with the opportunity to come to school ready and able to learn
- 12 the skills under subsection (1) of this section. In order to meet the
- 13 basic education obligation, the legislature finds that all students
- 14 need the opportunity to have adequate food, shelter, clothing, health
- 15 care, protection from abuse, and guidance and caring supervision by
- 16 adults to ensure that every student is ready to learn when he or she
- 17 begins school and is able to learn during his or her elementary and
- 18 secondary education.
