- 1 AN ACT Relating to dangerous weapons on elementary or secondary
- 2 school premises; amending RCW 9.41.280; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 9.41.280 and 1989 c 219 s 1 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) It is unlawful for ((an elementary or secondary school student
- 7 under the age of twenty-one knowingly)) a person to carry onto public
- 8 or private elementary or secondary school premises:
- 9 (a) Any firearm; or
- 10 (b) Any dangerous weapon as defined in RCW 9.41.250; or
- 11 (c) Any device commonly known as "nun-chu-ka sticks", consisting of
- 12 two or more lengths of wood, metal, plastic, or similar substance
- 13 connected with wire, rope, or other means; or

- 1 (d) Any device, commonly known as "throwing stars", which are
- 2 multi-pointed, metal objects designed to embed upon impact from any
- 3 aspect; or
- 4 (e) Any air gun, including any air pistol or air rifle, designed to
- 5 propel a BB, pellet, or other projectile by the discharge of compressed
- 6 air, carbon dioxide, or other gas.
- 7 (2) Any such ((student)) person violating subsection (1) of this
- 8 section is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- 9 Any violation of subsection (1) of this section by elementary or
- 10 <u>secondary school students</u> constitutes grounds for expulsion.
- 11 (3) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to:
- 12 (a) Any student <u>or employee</u> of a private military academy; or
- (b) Any ((student)) person engaged in military, law enforcement, or
- 14 <u>security</u> activities((, sponsored by the federal or state governments))
- 15 while engaged in official duties; or
- 16 (c) Any ((student)) person who is ((attending)) involved in a
- 17 convention, showing, demonstration, lecture, or firearms safety course
- 18 authorized by school authorities in which the firearms of collectors or
- 19 instructors are handled or displayed; or
- 20 (d) Any ((student)) person who possesses nun-chu-ka sticks,
- 21 throwing stars, or other dangerous weapons to be used in martial arts
- 22 classes conducted on the school premises; or
- 23 (e) Any ((student)) person while the ((student)) person is
- 24 participating in a firearms or air gun competition approved by the
- 25 school or school district.
