SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6188

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the fiscal impact of proposed legislation;
- 2 amending RCW 43.88A.010, 43.88A.020, 43.88A.030, 43.88A.040,
- 3 43.132.010, 43.132.020, 43.132.030, 43.132.040, and 43.132.050; adding
- 4 new sections to chapter 43.88A RCW; adding a new section to chapter
- 5 43.132 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.88A.010 and 1977 ex.s. c 25 s 1 are each amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 The legislature hereby recognizes the necessity of developing an
- 10 <u>accurate</u> uniform, <u>independent</u>, and coordinated procedure for
- 11 determining the expected fiscal impact of bills and resolutions on
- 12 state government. The legislature also recognizes that developing such
- 13 statements of fiscal impact, which shall be known as fiscal notes,

- 1 requires the ((designation of a state)) establishment of an independent
- 2 agency to be principally responsible therefor.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.88A RCW
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (1) The fiscal note council is established. The council shall
- 6 consist of the director of financial management and the director of
- 7 community development, or their designees, and four individuals, one of
- 8 whom shall be appointed by each chairperson of the two largest
- 9 political caucuses in the senate and house of representatives. The
- 10 chair of the council shall be selected from among the four caucus
- 11 appointees. The council may select such other officers as the members
- 12 deem necessary.
- 13 (2) The council shall employ a fiscal note supervisor to supervise
- 14 the preparation of all fiscal notes. As used in this chapter,
- 15 "supervisor" means the fiscal note supervisor. The council may fix the
- 16 compensation of the supervisor. The supervisor shall employ staff
- 17 sufficient to accomplish the purposes of this chapter and shall, to the
- 18 extent possible, use existing resources available from legislative
- 19 committees and state agencies.
- 20 (3) The council shall oversee the preparation of fiscal notes
- 21 prepared under this chapter and chapter 43.132 RCW.
- 22 (4) A council member who does not agree with a fiscal note approved
- 23 by the supervisor may request, and the supervisor shall provide, an
- 24 alternative fiscal note based on assumptions specified by the member.
- 25 (5) Legislative members of the council shall serve without
- 26 additional compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in
- 27 accordance with RCW 44.04.120 while attending sessions of the council
- 28 or on official business authorized by the council. Nonlegislative

- 1 members of the council shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in
- 2 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- 3 Sec. 3. RCW 43.88A.020 and 1979 c 151 s 146 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 <u>(1)</u> The ((office of financial management)) council shall, in
- 6 cooperation with appropriate legislative committees and ((legislative
- 7 staff)) state agencies, establish a procedure for the provision of
- 8 fiscal notes on the expected impact of bills and resolutions which
- 9 increase or decrease or tend to increase or decrease state government
- 10 revenues or expenditures. Such fiscal notes shall indicate by fiscal
- 11 year the impact for the remainder of the biennium in which the bill or
- 12 resolution will first take effect as well as a cumulative forecast of
- 13 the fiscal impact for the succeeding four fiscal years. Where
- 14 necessary to adequately reflect the full costs and benefits of the bill
- 15 or resolution, the council shall provide for a long-term fiscal
- 16 <u>analysis that projects the impact of the legislation for at least ten</u>
- 17 <u>succeeding fiscal years</u>. The fiscal note may include, in appropriate
- 18 <u>instances</u>, an analysis of the bill's or resolution's impact on those
- 19 <u>sectors of the state's economy that are the most directly affected.</u>
- 20 (2) The council shall prepare model fiscal note forms that apply,
- 21 to the extent possible, to each of the six functional areas of the
- 22 state biennial appropriations act. The council shall prepare a
- 23 procedure for incorporating relevant elements of cost-benefit analysis
- 24 into fiscal note preparation.
- 25 (3) The council shall periodically review and make recommendations
- 26 to improve the process by which fiscal notes are requested, prepared,
- 27 <u>and distributed.</u>
- 28 (4) In establishing the fiscal impact called for pursuant to this
- 29 chapter, the ((office of financial management)) council shall

- 1 coordinate the development of fiscal notes with all state agencies
- 2 affected.
- 3 Sec. 4. RCW 43.88A.030 and 1986 c 158 s 16 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 When a fiscal note is prepared and approved as to form, accuracy,
- 6 and completeness ((by the office of financial management)) pursuant to
- 7 the procedures established by the council, which depicts the expected
- 8 fiscal impact of a bill or resolution, copies shall be filed
- 9 immediately with:
- 10 (1) The chairperson of the committee to which the bill or
- 11 resolution was referred upon introduction in the house of origin;
- 12 (2) The senate committee on ways and means, or its successor; and
- 13 (3) The house committees on revenue and appropriations, or their
- 14 successors.
- Whenever possible, such fiscal note shall be provided prior to or
- 16 at the time the bill or resolution is first heard by the committee of
- 17 reference in the house of origin. The council shall establish
- 18 priorities for the completion of requested fiscal notes, with the
- 19 highest priority given to legislation that has been scheduled for a
- 20 <u>hearing before a committee of the legislature.</u>
- 21 When a fiscal note has been prepared for a bill or resolution, a
- 22 copy of the fiscal note shall be placed in the bill books or otherwise
- 23 attached to the bill or resolution and shall remain with the bill or
- 24 resolution throughout the legislative process insofar as possible.
- 25 **Sec. 5.** RCW 43.88A.040 and 1979 c 151 s 148 are each amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- 27 The ((office of financial management)) council shall also provide
- 28 a fiscal note on any legislative proposal at the request of any

- 1 legislator. Such fiscal note shall be returned to the requesting
- 2 legislator, and copies shall be filed with the appropriate legislative
- 3 committees pursuant to RCW 43.88A.030 at the time such proposed
- 4 legislation is introduced in either house.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 43.88A RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates otherwise,
- 8 "council" means the fiscal note council.
- 9 **Sec. 7.** RCW 43.132.010 and 1977 ex.s. c 19 s 1 are each amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- It is the intent of this chapter to create ((a)) an accurate
- 12 uniform, independent, and coordinated procedure to determine the fiscal
- 13 impact of proposed legislation on units of local government.
- 14 **Sec. 8.** RCW 43.132.020 and 1984 c 125 s 16 are each amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 The ((director of financial management or the director's designee))
- 17 council shall, in cooperation with appropriate legislative committees
- 18 and ((legislative staff)) state agencies, establish a mechanism for the
- 19 determination of the fiscal impact of proposed legislation which if
- 20 enacted into law would directly or indirectly increase or decrease
- 21 revenues received or expenditures incurred by counties, cities, towns,
- 22 or any other political subdivisions of the state. The ((office of
- 23 financial management)) council shall, when requested by a member of the
- 24 state legislature, report in writing as to such fiscal impact and said
- 25 report shall be known as a "local government fiscal note".
- Such fiscal notes shall indicate by fiscal year the total impact on
- 27 the subdivisions involved for the first two years the legislation would

- 1 be in effect and also a cumulative six year forecast of the fiscal
- 2 impact. Where feasible and applicable, the fiscal note also shall
- 3 indicate the fiscal impact on each individual county or on a
- 4 representative sampling of cities, towns, or other political
- 5 subdivisions. Where necessary to adequately reflect the full costs and
- 6 benefits of the bill or resolution, the council shall provide for a
- 7 long-term fiscal analysis that projects the impact of the legislation
- 8 for at least the ten succeeding fiscal years.
- 9 A <u>local government</u> fiscal note as defined in this section shall be
- 10 provided only upon request of any member of the state legislature. A
- 11 legislator also may request that such a fiscal note be revised to
- 12 reflect the impact of proposed amendments or substitute bills. Fiscal
- 13 notes shall be completed within seventy-two hours of the request unless
- 14 a longer time period is allowed by the requesting legislator. In the
- 15 event a fiscal note has not been completed within seventy-two hours of
- 16 a request, a daily report shall be prepared for the requesting
- 17 legislator by the ((director of financial management)) council which
- 18 report summarizes the progress in preparing the fiscal note. ((If the
- 19 request is referred to the director of community development, the daily
- 20 report shall also include the date and time such referral was made.))
- 21 The council shall establish priorities for the completion of requested
- 22 <u>fiscal notes</u>, with the highest priority given to legislation that has
- 23 been scheduled for a hearing before a committee of the legislature.
- 24 Sec. 9. RCW 43.132.030 and 1985 c 6 s 10 are each amended to read
- 25 as follows:
- 26 ((The director of financial management is hereby empowered to
- 27 designate the director of community development as the official
- 28 responsible for the preparation of fiscal notes authorized and required
- 29 by this chapter.)) It is the intent of the legislature that, when

- 1 necessary, the resources of other state agencies, appropriate
- 2 legislative staffs, and the various associations of local government
- 3 may be employed in the development of ((such)) local government fiscal
- 4 notes.
- 5 **Sec. 10.** RCW 43.132.040 and 1986 c 158 s 18 are each amended to
- 6 read as follows:0
- 7 When a <u>local government</u> fiscal note is prepared and approved as to
- 8 form and completeness ((by the director of financial management))
- 9 pursuant to the procedures established by the council, the ((director))
- 10 <u>council</u> shall transmit copies immediately to:
- 11 (1) The requesting legislator;
- 12 (2) With respect to proposed legislation held by the senate, the
- 13 chairperson of the committee which holds or has acted upon the proposed
- 14 legislation, the chairperson of the ways and means committee, the
- 15 chairperson of the ((local government)) governmental operations
- 16 committee, and the secretary of the senate; and
- 17 (3) With respect to proposed legislation held by the house of
- 18 representatives, the chairperson of the committee which holds or has
- 19 acted upon the proposed legislation, the chairpersons of the revenue
- 20 and taxation and appropriations committees, the chairperson of the
- 21 local government committee, and the chief clerk of the house of
- 22 representatives.
- 23 **Sec. 11.** RCW 43.132.050 and 1986 c 158 s 19 are each amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 The ((office of financial management)) council may make additional
- 26 copies of the <u>local government</u> fiscal note available to members of the
- 27 legislature and others on request.

- 1 At the request of any member of the senate or house of
- 2 representatives, whichever is considering the proposed legislation, and
- 3 unless it is prohibited by the rules of the body, copies of the fiscal
- 4 note or a synopsis thereof shall be placed on the members' desks at the
- 5 time the proposed legislation takes its place on the second reading
- 6 calendar.
- 7 Whenever proposed legislation accompanied by such a <u>local</u>
- 8 government fiscal note is passed by either the senate or the house of
- 9 representatives, the fiscal note shall be transmitted with the bill to
- 10 the other house.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** A new section is added to chapter 43.132
- 12 RCW to read as follows:
- 13 As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates otherwise,
- 14 "council" means the fiscal note council established under chapter
- 15 43.88A RCW.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** (1) All reports, documents, records,
- 17 files, or written material in the possession of the office of financial
- 18 management or the department of community development relating to the
- 19 powers, functions, and duties transferred by this act shall be
- 20 delivered to the custody of the fiscal note council. All cabinets,
- 21 furniture, office equipment, and other tangible property employed by
- 22 the office of financial management or the department of community
- 23 development in carrying out the powers, functions, and duties
- 24 transferred by this act shall be made available to the fiscal note
- 25 council.
- 26 (2) During fiscal year 1993, the office of financial management
- 27 shall withhold from appropriations to agencies of the executive branch
- 28 the sum of two hundred thousand dollars to reflect the transfer of the

- 1 statutory duty to prepare and review state and local government fiscal
- 2 notes. This amount shall be transferred to, and available for
- 3 expenditure by, the fiscal note council during fiscal year 1993 for the
- 4 purposes of this act.
