## SENATE BILL 6221

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to western Washington pheasant hunting; amending
- 2 RCW 77.32.350; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.350 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 9 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 In addition to a basic hunting license, a supplemental license,
- 7 permit, or stamp is required to hunt for quail, partridge, pheasant, or
- 8 migratory waterfowl, to hunt with a raptor, or to hunt wild animals
- 9 with a dog.
- 10 (1) A hound permit is required to hunt wild animals, except rabbits
- 11 and hares, with a dog. The fee for this permit is twelve dollars.
- 12 (2) An eastern Washington upland game bird permit is required to
- 13 hunt for quail, partridge, and pheasant in eastern Washington. The fee
- 14 for this permit is ten dollars.

- 1 (3) A western Washington upland game bird permit is required to
- 2 hunt for quail, partridge, and pheasant in western Washington. The fee
- 3 for this permit is thirty-five dollars. Western Washington upland game
- 4 bird permits must contain numbered spaces for recording the location
- 5 and date of harvest of each western Washington pheasant. It is
- 6 unlawful to harvest a western Washington pheasant without immediately
- 7 recording this information on the permit.
- 8 (4) Effective January 1,  $((\frac{1992}{1993}))$  1993, the permit shall be
- 9 available as a season option, ((an early season option, a late season
- 10 option,)) a juvenile full season option, or a two-day option. The fee
- 11 for this permit is:
- 12 (a) For the full season option, thirty-five dollars;
- 13 (b) ((For the early season option, twenty-five dollars;
- 14 (c) For the late season option, twenty-five dollars;
- 15 <del>(d)</del>)) For the juvenile full season or the two-day option, twenty
- 16 dollars.
- 17 For the purposes of this subsection a juvenile is defined as a
- 18 person under fifteen years of age upon the opening date of the western
- 19 Washington pheasant season.
- 20 ((<del>(4)</del>)) <u>(5) It is unlawful for a person to harvest more than two</u>
- 21 pheasants a day in western Washington. Western Washington upland game
- 22 permits are valid for the following number of pheasants and harvesting
- 23 pheasants in excess of these numbers requires another permit:
- 24 (a) A full season permit is valid for no more than ten pheasants;
- 25 (b) A juvenile full season permit is valid for no more than six
- 26 pheasants;
- 27 (c) A two-day permit is valid for no more than four pheasants.
- 28 (6) A falconry license is required to possess or hunt with a
- 29 raptor, including seasons established exclusively for hunting in that
- 30 manner. The fee for this license is thirty-six dollars.

- 1 (((5))) (7) A migratory waterfowl stamp affixed to a basic hunting
- 2 license is required for all persons sixteen years of age or older to
- 3 hunt migratory waterfowl. The fee for the stamp is six dollars.
- 4 (((6))) (8) The migratory waterfowl stamp shall be validated by the
- 5 signature of the licensee written across the face of the stamp.
- 6  $((\frac{7}{1}))$  (9) The migratory waterfowl stamps required by this section
- 7 expire on March 31st following the date of issuance.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act shall take effect January 1,
- 9 1993. The director of wildlife may take steps necessary to ensure that
- 10 this act is implemented on its effective date.
