SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6278

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington rural development council; adding
- 2 new sections to chapter 43.63A RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Given the rapid change in both the
- 5 structure of the state and world economy, it is recognized that
- 6 experiments in identifying, communicating, and acting upon new means of
- 7 protecting and enhancing the viability and self reliance of rural
- 8 Washington communities are needed. Voluntary and meaningful
- 9 communication between all levels of government, including tribal
- 10 governments, and the nonprofit and private sectors is critical for the
- 11 representation of the needs and interests of rural residents. It is
- 12 also of critical importance to the integrity of the entire state to
- 13 identify ways that urban and rural economies of Washington can function

- 1 to complement each other and reinforce the quality of life available to
- 2 residents.
- 3 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. There is established formal recognition
- 4 of the efforts of the Washington state rural development council, in
- 5 operation since February of 1991, through the voluntary support of
- 6 state, federal, and local government and private businesses and
- 7 citizens. In acknowledgment and recognition of these efforts all
- 8 agencies and branches of state government that operate programs in
- 9 rural areas of the state are encouraged to actively participate in the
- 10 activities of the council.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The Washington state rural development
- 12 council is a partnership among state, federal, and local governments,
- 13 tribal governments, and the public and private sectors, and is
- 14 organized to meet the needs of all members of the partnership. The
- 15 council is organized as a mutual effort to mitigate negative impacts
- 16 upon rural communities, enhance their viability and self reliance, and
- 17 look for ways to coordinate, synchronize, or consolidate the efforts of
- 18 all who serve rural communities and citizens.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The Washington state rural development
- 20 council's mission has been determined by public forum to be: According
- 21 to locally conceived and driven strategies, to coordinate and apply
- 22 private, local, state, tribal, and federal resources to support the
- 23 development of viable, self-reliant rural communities. A primary
- 24 function of the council is that of facilitator, serving as a forum for
- 25 communication between the council's constituencies and stakeholders;
- 26 change agent, acting as both a sounding board for emerging issues and
- 27 an advocate for change in policies and rules that inhibit the viability

- 1 of rural communities; and resource developer, serving to maximize
- 2 knowledge of discretionary resources throughout rural areas of the
- 3 state.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The costs incurred by the Washington state
- 5 rural development council shall be limited to amounts appropriated by
- 6 state and federal governments specifically for its use, membership
- 7 fees, and grants from public and private sources.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The objectives of the Washington state
- 9 rural development council should be consistent with the council's
- 10 mission and honor the perspectives of the partnership in its
- 11 undertaking of the following:
- 12 (1) Providing a forum for policy analysis concerning existing and
- 13 proposed rural development strategies in Washington;
- 14 (2) Promoting coordination and cooperation between all levels of
- 15 government, and private, public, and nonprofit groups in order to
- 16 promote rural economic vitality;
- 17 (3) Facilitating communication between rural communities and
- 18 organizations and other sectors of the state and nation;
- 19 (4) Promoting the establishment of rural-urban linkage partnerships
- 20 that will be mutually beneficial to both areas in alleviating the
- 21 distress of rapid economic growth or decline and promoting economic
- 22 vitality;
- 23 (5) Identifying and addressing federal, state, and local
- 24 administrative barriers that hinder economic vitality;
- 25 (6) Identifying and providing opportunities to educate and inform
- 26 state, federal, and local policy and program staff as to the needs and
- 27 special development context of rural Washington; and

- 1 (7) Promoting the establishment of educational and training
- 2 opportunities for individuals in rural areas.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** The Washington state rural development
- 4 council shall be located in a branch or agency of either the federal or
- 5 state government according to a memorandum of understanding between the
- 6 host agency and the partners represented on the council.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. Sections 2 through 7 of this act are
- 8 each added to chapter 43.63A RCW.
