SENATE BILL 6302

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to accountability and collaboration in higher
- 2 education and K-12 education; and adding new sections to chapter 28B.10
- 3 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that some students
- 6 who have recently graduated from high school must enroll in remedial
- 7 classes at the public colleges and universities before they are ready
- 8 to begin college work. The legislature also finds that these students
- 9 should have received basic skills in English, reading, spelling,
- 10 grammar, and mathematics before graduating from high school. It is the
- 11 intent of the legislature that students enrolled in remedial classes
- 12 continue to pay tuition for those classes. It is further the intent of
- 13 the legislature that the school districts from which these students
- 14 received their high school diplomas pay some of the cost of providing

- 1 remedial classes for recent high school graduates. It is also the
- 2 intent of the legislature that money raised through these charges to
- 3 school districts be used to pay needy college students to tutor in the
- 4 public schools of the state.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** By May 1st of each year, each
- 6 institution of higher education shall provide a report to the office of
- 7 the superintendent of public instruction. The report shall contain the
- 8 following information: (1) The numbers of students who graduated from
- 9 a Washington high school within three years of enrolling in a state-
- 10 supported precollege level class in mathematics, reading, grammar,
- 11 spelling, writing, or English; (2) the types of precollege classes in
- 12 which each student is enrolled; and (3) the Washington high school from
- 13 which each student graduated. Each institution of higher education
- 14 shall also report information on precollege class enrollment to the
- 15 Washington school district from which each student enrolled in a
- 16 precollege class graduated.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** By June 30th of each odd-numbered year,
- 18 the state board for community and technical colleges shall establish
- 19 and report to the superintendent of public instruction an average per
- 20 student instructional cost for state-supported developmental and
- 21 precollege classes offered in the community and technical colleges.
- 22 The classes shall include, but need not be limited to precollege
- 23 classes in a mathematical science, grammar, reading, spelling, writing,
- 24 and English. Classes in study skills shall not be included.
- 25 By June 30th of each odd-numbered year, each of the four-year
- 26 universities and colleges shall report to the office of the
- 27 superintendent of public instruction with the average per student
- 28 instructional cost for state-supported precollege classes offered by

- 1 that institution in a mathematical science, English, writing, spelling,
- 2 grammar, and reading.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A charge shall be assessed to each
- 4 Washington school district that, within the three years preceding the
- 5 report required in section 2 of this act, graduated a student attending
- 6 any state-supported precollege class in English, reading, spelling,
- 7 grammar, or a mathematical science. At the beginning of the fiscal
- 8 year following the report described in section 2 of this act, the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction shall subtract from the allotment
- 10 of each such school district, an amount equal to the average per
- 11 student instructional cost of each precollege class attended during the
- 12 preceding fiscal year by a student who graduated from that school
- 13 district during the preceding three years. Funding shall first be
- 14 reduced from nonbasic education funds, unless otherwise requested by
- 15 the affected school district.
- 16 The superintendent of public instruction shall deposit the funds
- 17 collected under this section in the tutor account created in section 6
- 18 of this act.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The higher education coordinating board,
- 20 in consultation with the superintendent of public instruction and other
- 21 appropriate organizations, shall use the funds in the tutor account to
- 22 train tutors and to pay college and university students participating
- 23 in the state work-study program to tutor in the public schools of the
- 24 state. The funds may be used to pay all or a portion of the salaries
- 25 of students in the state work-study program.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The tutor account is created in the
- 27 custody of the state treasurer. Funds collected under section 4 of

- 1 this act shall be deposited into the account. Expenditures from the
- 2 account may be used only to pay college and university students in the
- 3 state work-study program to tutor in state public schools. Only the
- 4 chair of the higher education coordinating board or the chair's
- 5 designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is
- 6 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no
- 7 appropriation is required for expenditures.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 6 of this act are
- 9 each added to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
