
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 6315

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to solid fuel burning devices; creating new
- 2 sections; making an appropriation; and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that solid fuel
- 5 burning devices contribute up to twenty percent of the state's air
- 6 pollution problems. The legislature recognizes advancements made by
- 7 the industry to produce more efficient, cleaner burning, and less
- 8 polluting devices. However, regulatory agencies base their
- 9 administrative and enforcement policies on testing and monitoring
- 10 standards that do not recognize current technology.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The task force on the testing and
- 12 certification of solid fuel burning devices is created to:

- 1 (1) Review current federal and state testing and certification
- 2 requirements and procedures;
- 3 (2) Recommend alternatives to current federal and state testing and
- 4 certification requirements and procedures;
- 5 (3) Conduct a pilot study to develop testing and certification
- 6 procedures; and
- 7 (4) Recommend new emission standards for devices sold in the state
- 8 of Washington based on its findings.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The task force shall be appointed by the
- 10 speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate
- 11 and shall consist of:
- 12 (1) Two members from the house of representatives committee on
- 13 environmental affairs;
- 14 (2) Two members from the senate committee on environment and
- 15 natural resources;
- 16 (3) Two members from the house of representatives committee on
- 17 energy and utilities;
- 18 (4) Two members from the senate committee on energy and utilitie;
- 19 (5) One member representing solid fuel burning device manufacturers
- 20 recommended by the chair of the house committee on environmental
- 21 affairs and one member by the chair of the senate committee on
- 22 environment and natural resources; and
- 23 (6) One member representing the environmental community recommended
- 24 by the chair of the house environmental affairs committee and one
- 25 member by the chair of the senate committee on environment and natural
- 26 resources.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** In developing recommendations, the task
- 28 force shall consult with representatives from the federal environmental

- 1 protection agency, department of ecology, local air authorities, solid
- 2 fuel burning device dealers and manufacturers, public and investor-
- 3 owned utilities, citizen organizations, environmental organizations,
- 4 and public health organizations.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** There is appropriated for the biennium
- 6 ending June 30, 1993, to the department of ecology from the wood stove
- 7 education and enforcement account, RCW 70.94.483, dollars
- 8 for the purposes of this act.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** By November 1, 1993, the task force
- 10 shall report to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** This act shall expire July 1, 1994.
