## SENATE BILL 6326

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington award for excellence; amending
- 2 RCW 28A.625.041, 28A.625.065, 28B.80.255, and 28B.80.265; providing an
- 3 effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.625.041 and 1991 c 255 s 3 are each amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) All recipients of the Washington award for excellence in
- 8 education shall receive a certificate presented by the governor and the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction, or their designated
- 10 representatives, at a public ceremony or ceremonies in appropriate
- 11 locations.
- 12 (2) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
- 13 section, awards for teachers and principals or administrators shall
- 14 include one of the following:

- 1 (a) Except as provided under RCW 28B.80.255, an academic grant 2 which shall be used to take courses at a state institution of higher 3 education. The academic grant shall ((not exceed the current academic
- 5 the state's research universities and shall not exceed the current

year full-time resident graduate tuition for courses taken at one of

- the state's research universities and shall not exceed the current
- 6 academic year full-time resident graduate tuition for courses taken at
- 7 one of the state's regional universities or The Evergreen State
- 8 College)) provide reimbursement to the recipient for actual costs
- 9 <u>incurred for tuition and fees for up to forty-five quarter credit hours</u>
- 10 or thirty semester credit hours at a rate of reimbursement per credit
- 11 hour not to exceed the resident graduate, part-time cost per credit
- 12 <u>hour at the University of Washington in the year the recipient takes</u>
- 13 the credits. In addition, a stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars
- 14 shall be provided for costs incurred in taking courses covered by the
- 15 academic grant. This stipend shall be provided as reimbursement for
- 16 <u>actual costs incurred</u>. The academic grant shall not be considered
- 17 compensation for the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200; or
- 18 (b) A recognition stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
- 19 <u>recognition</u> stipend shall not be considered compensation for the
- 20 purposes of RCW 28A.400.200; or
- 21 (c) An educational grant not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
- 22 educational grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060 and shall not
- 23 be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200.
- 24 (3) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
- 25 section, the award for the superintendent shall include one of the
- 26 following:

- 27 (a) A recognition stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
- 28 <u>recognition</u> stipend shall not be considered compensation for the
- 29 purposes of RCW 28A.400.200; or

- 1 (b) An educational grant not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
- 2 educational grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060 and shall not
- 3 be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200.
- 4 (4) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
- 5 section, the award for the school board shall include an educational
- 6 grant not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars. The educational
- 7 grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060.
- 8 (5) Within one year of receiving the Washington award for
- 9 excellence in education, teachers, principals or administrators, and
- 10 the school district superintendent shall notify the superintendent of
- 11 public instruction in writing of their decision to apply for an
- 12 academic grant, a recognition stipend, or an educational grant as
- 13 provided under subsections (2) and (3) of this section. The
- 14 superintendent shall notify the higher education coordinating board of
- 15 those recipients who select the academic grant.
- 16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.625.065 and 1991 c 255 s 4 are each amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (((1) The dollar value of the academic grant under RCW
- 19 28A.625.041(2)(a) shall be the amount as provided under RCW
- 20 28A.625.041(2)(a) at the time the grant is awarded by the higher
- 21 education coordinating board.
- (2) (2))) Courses paid for in full by the academic grant under RCW
- 23 28A.625.041(2)(a) shall be completed within four years after the
- 24 academic grant is received.
- 25 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.80.255 and 1991 c 255 s 6 are each amended to read
- 26 as follows:
- 27 (1) Teachers and principals or administrators who select an
- 28 academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a) shall use the grant to

- 1 attend a state public institution of higher education located in the
- 2 state of Washington, except that the academic grant may be used for
- 3 courses at a private institution of higher education in the state of
- 4 Washington if the conditions in subsection (3) of this section are met,
- 5 and the academic grant may be used for courses at a public or a private
- 6 institution of higher education in another state or country if the
- 7 conditions in subsection (4) of this section are met.
- 8 (2) "Institution of higher education" means:
- 9 (a) Any public university, college, community college, or
- 10 vocational-technical institute operated by the state of Washington or
- 11 any political subdivision thereof; or
- 12 (b) Any other university, college, school, or institute in the
- 13 state of Washington offering instruction beyond the high school level
- 14 which is a member institution of an accrediting association recognized
- 15 by rule of the board. Any institution, branch, extension, or facility
- 16 operating within the state of Washington which is affiliated with an
- 17 institution operating in another state must be a separately accredited
- 18 member institution of an accrediting association recognized by the
- 19 board.
- 20 (3) Teachers and principals or administrators who select an
- 21 academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a) may use the grant for
- 22 courses at any private institution as defined in subsection (2)(b) of
- 23 this section subject to the following conditions:
- 24 (a) The academic grant shall ((not exceed the current academic year
- 25 full-time resident graduate tuition and the services and activities
- 26 fees in effect at the state-funded research universities)) provide
- 27 reimbursement to the recipient for actual costs incurred for tuition
- 28 and fees for up to forty-five quarter credit hours or thirty semester
- 29 credit hours at a rate of reimbursement per credit hour not to exceed
- 30 the resident graduate, part-time cost per credit hour at the University

- 1 of Washington in the year the recipient takes the credits. In
- 2 addition, a stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars shall be
- 3 provided for costs incurred in taking courses covered by the academic

- 6 (b) The academic grant shall be contingent on the private
- 7 institution matching on at least a dollar-for-dollar basis, either with
- 8 actual money or by waiver of fees, the amount of the academic grant
- 9 received by the recipient from the state; and
- 10 (c) The academic grant may not be used for any courses that include
- 11 any religious worship or exercise, or apply to any degree in religious,
- 12 seminarian, or theological academic studies.
- 13 (4) Teachers and principals or administrators who select an
- 14 academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a) may use the grant for
- 15 courses at a public or private higher education institution in another
- 16 state or country subject to the following conditions:
- 17 (a) The institution has an exchange program with a public or
- 18 private higher education institution in Washington and the exchange
- 19 program is approved or recognized by the higher education coordinating
- 20 board; or
- 21 (b) The institution is approved or recognized by the higher
- 22 education coordinating board; and
- 23 (c) The recipient of the Washington award for excellence in
- 24 education has submitted in writing to the higher education coordinating
- 25 board an explanation of why the preferred course or courses are not
- 26 available at a public or private institution in Washington; and
- 27 (d) The academic grant may not be used for any courses that include
- 28 any religious worship or exercise, or apply to any degree in religious,
- 29 seminarian, or theological academic studies.

- 1 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28B.80.265 and 1991 c 255 s 7 are each amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) The higher education coordinating board shall adopt rules as
- 4 necessary under chapter 34.05 RCW to administer the academic grants
- 5 awarded under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a).
- 6 (2) The rules adopted by the board shall ((allow recipients who
- 7 have begun to use the waiver of tuition and fees under RCW 28B.15.547
- 8 prior to May 17, 1991, to take the remaining value of the waiver of
- 9 tuition and fees in the form of the academic grant under RCW
- 10 28A.625.041(2)(a)) reflect that the changes to RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a)
- 11 <u>in section 1, chapter ..., Laws of 1992 (section 1 of this act) shall</u>
- 12 apply to all recipients of a Washington award for excellence in
- 13 education, regardless of the statutory language in effect at the time
- 14 the award was granted.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 16 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 17 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 18 effect April 30, 1992.
