State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to salaries of state elected officials; and
2 amending RCW 43.03.011, 43.03.012, and 43.03.013.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.03.011 and 1991 sp.s. c 1 s 1 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 Pursuant to Article XXVIII, section 1 of the state Constitution and
7 RCW 43.03.010 and 43.03.310, the annual salaries of the state elected
8 officials of the executive branch shall be as follows:

9 (1) Effective September 3, 1990:

- 11 (b) Lieutenant governor \$ 52,600
- 12 (c) Secretary of state \$ 54,200
- 13 (d) Treasurer \$ 67,000

1 (4) The lieutenant governor shall receive the fixed amount of his
2 or her salary plus 1/260th of the difference between his or her salary
3 and that of the governor for each day that the lieutenant governor is
4 called upon to perform the duties of the governor by reason of the
5 absence from the state, removal, resignation, death, or disability of
6 the governor.

7 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.03.012 and 1991 sp.s. c 1 s 2 are each amended to
8 read as follows:

9 Pursuant to Article XXVIII, section 1 of the state Constitution and
10 RCW 2.04.092, 2.06.062, 2.08.092, 3.58.010, and 43.03.310, the annual
11 salaries of the judges of the state shall be as follows:

12 (1) Effective September 3, 1990:

- 14 (b) Judges of the court of appeals \$ 84,900
- 15 (c) Judges of the superior court \$ 80,500
- 16 (d) Full-time judges of the district court \$ 76,600

25 section 712, chapter 16, Laws of 1991 sp. sess., are not fully
26 implemented in the 1992 supplemental omnibus appropriations act, in
27 which case the following salaries shall not take effect:

- 28 (a) Justices of the supreme court \$ 107,200
- 29 (b) Judges of the court of appeals \$ 101,900

- 1 (c) Judges of the superior court \$ 96,600
- 2 (d) Full-time judges of the district court \$ 91,900
- 3 (4) The salary for a part-time district court judge shall be the
- 4 proportion of full-time work for which the position is authorized,
- 5 multiplied by the salary for a full-time district court judge.

6 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.03.013 and 1991 sp.s. c 1 s 3 are each amended to
 7 read as follows:

8 Pursuant to Article XXVIII, section 1 of the state Constitution and
 9 RCW 43.03.010 and 43.03.310, the annual salary of members of the
 10 legislature shall be:

- 11 (1) Effective September 3, 1990:
- 12 (a) Legislator \$ 19,900
- 13 (b) Speaker of the house \$ 21,900
- 14 (c) Senate majority leader \$ 20,900
- 15 (d) Senate minority leader \$ 20,900
- 16 (e) House minority leader \$ 20,900
- 17 (2) Effective September 3, 1991:
- 18 (a) Legislator \$ 23,200
- 19 (b) Speaker of the house \$ 29,000
- 20 (c) Senate majority leader \$ 25,100
- 21 (d) Senate minority leader \$ 25,100
- 22 (e) House minority leader. \$ 25,100
- 23 (3) Effective September 3, 1992, unless the salary increases for
- 24 teachers provided for in section 503, chapter 16, Laws of 1991 sp.
- 25 sess., and the salary increases for state employees provided for in
- 26 section 712, chapter 16, Laws of 1991 sp. sess., are not fully
- 27 implemented in the 1992 supplemental omnibus appropriations act, in
- 28 which case the following salaries shall not take effect:
