SENATE BILL 6366

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to school-age children at risk due to prenatal drug
- 2 or alcohol exposure; creating new sections; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an alarmingly
- 6 increasing number of children are exposed to drugs including crack
- 7 cocaine and to alcohol before they are born. These children are
- 8 biologically at risk due to the prenatal drug or alcohol exposure. The
- 9 legislature finds that the state of Washington cannot afford to condemn
- 10 these children to becoming a lost generation. The legislature further
- 11 finds that by beginning the planning process to design effective
- 12 programs once the children enter the school system, our school system
- 13 can become better equipped to successfully educate all of our children
- 14 to become productive and educated citizens.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The planning for learning project is
- 2 created. The purpose of the project is to begin to develop and
- 3 distribute information about effective teaching methods for elementary
- 4 age school children who are at risk due to prenatal drug or alcohol
- 5 exposure. One of the goals of the project is to create a report that
- 6 can be used by educators on what is known about effective teaching
- 7 practices for such children. The project shall be conducted to do the
- 8 following:
- 9 (a) Compile and analyze existing research on effective teaching and
- 10 learning strategies for children who are biologically at risk due to
- 11 prenatal drug or alcohol exposure;
- 12 (b) Develop recommendations for further research if necessary and
- 13 program implementation; and
- 14 (c) Develop policy recommendations for school districts, the
- 15 superintendent of public instruction, and the legislature.
- 16 (2) The report shall be completed by December 15, 1992, and
- 17 submitted to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature and
- 18 the superintendent of public instruction.
- 19 (3) This section shall expire January 1, 1993.
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of forty-five thousand dollars,
- 21 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the
- 22 biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the University
- 23 of Washington for the fetal alcohol and drug unit of the department of
- 24 psychiatry and behavioral science in the University of Washington
- 25 school of medicine to conduct the study. The University of Washington
- 26 shall not charge or deduct indirect costs of any kind from this sum.
- 27 The fetal alcohol and drug unit shall work with school districts in
- 28 developing the recommendations.
