SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6377

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the TDD state-wide relay system; amending RCW
- 2 43.20A.725 and 43.20A.730; adding a new section to chapter 80.36 RCW;
- 3 and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the state of
- 6 Washington has shown national leadership in providing
- 7 telecommunications access for the hearing-impaired and speech-impaired
- 8 communities. The legislature further finds that the federal Americans
- 9 with Disabilities Act requires states to further enhance
- 10 telecommunications access for disabled persons and that the state
- 11 should be positioned to allow this service to be delivered with
- 12 fairness, flexibility, and efficiency.

- Sec. 2. RCW 43.20A.725 and 1990 c 89 s 3 are each amended to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The department shall maintain a program whereby TDDs, signal devices, a TDD relay system, and amplifying accessories capable of 4 5 serving the needs of the hearing and speech impaired shall be provided 6 at no charge additional to the basic exchange rate, to an individual of school age or older, (a) who is certified as hearing impaired by a 7 licensed physician, audiologist, or a qualified state agency, and to 8 9 any subscriber that is an organization representing the hearing 10 impaired, as determined and specified by the TDD advisory committee; or (b) who is certified as speech impaired by a licensed physician, speech 11 pathologist, or a qualified state agency, and to any subscriber that is 12 an organization representing the speech impaired, as determined and 13 14 specified by the TDD advisory committee. For the purpose of this section, certification implies that individuals cannot use the 15 16 telephone for expressive or receptive communications due to hearing or
- 18 (2) The office shall award contracts on a competitive basis, to 19 qualified persons for which eligibility to contract is determined by 20 the office, for the distribution and maintenance of such TDDs, signal devices, and amplifying accessories as shall be determined by the 21 When awarding such contracts, the office may consider the 22 office. quality of equipment and, with the director's approval, may award 23 24 contracts on a basis other than cost. Such contracts ((shall)) may 25 include a provision for the employment and use of a qualified trainer and the training of recipients in the use of such devices. 26
- 27 (3) The office shall establish and implement a policy for the 28 ultimate responsibility for recovery of TDDs, signal devices, and 29 amplifying accessories from recipients who are moving from this state 30 or who for other reasons are no longer using them.

- (4) Pursuant to recommendations of the TDD advisory committee, 1 2 until July 26, 1993, the office shall maintain a program whereby a relay system will be provided state-wide using operator intervention to 3 4 connect hearing impaired and speech impaired persons and offices or organizations representing the hearing impaired and speech impaired, as 5 6 determined and specified by the TDD advisory committee pursuant to RCW 43.20A.730. The relay system shall be the most cost-effective possible 7 and shall operate in a manner consistent with federal requirements for 8 9 such systems.
- 10 (5) <u>Pursuant to the recommendations of the TDD task force report of</u>
 11 <u>December 1991, and with the express purpose of maintaining state</u>
 12 <u>control and jurisdiction, the office shall seek certification by the</u>
 13 <u>federal communications commission of the state-wide relay service.</u>
- 14 (6) The office shall award contracts for the operation and maintenance of the state-wide relay service. The initial contract 15 shall be for service commencing July 26, 1993. The contract shall be 16 17 awarded to an individual company registered as a telecommunications 18 company by the utilities and transportation commission, to a group of 19 registered telecommunications companies, or to any other company or 20 organization determined by the office as qualified to provide relay services, contingent upon that company or organization being approved 21 as a registered telecommunications company prior to final contract 22 23 approval.
- 24 (7) The program shall be funded by telecommunications devices for 25 the deaf (TDD) excise tax applied to each switched access line provided 26 by the local exchange companies. The office shall determine, in 27 consultation with the TDD advisory committee, the amount of money 28 needed to fund the program on an annual basis, including both 29 operational costs and a reasonable amount for capital improvements such 30 as equipment upgrade and replacement. That information shall be given

in an annual budget to the utilities 1 by the department and 2 transportation commission no later than March 1 prior to the beginning of the fiscal year. The utilities and transportation commission shall 3 4 then determine the amount of TDD excise tax to be placed on each access line and shall inform each local exchange company of this amount no 5 6 later than May 15. The utilities and transportation commission shall determine the amount of TDD excise tax by dividing the total of the 7 program budget, as submitted by the office, by the total number of 8 9 access lines, and shall not exercise any further oversight of the program under this subsection. The TDD excise tax shall not exceed ten 10 cents per month per access line. Each local exchange company shall 11 impose the amount of excise tax determined by the commission as of July 12 1, and shall remit the amount collected directly to the department on 13 14 a monthly basis. The TDD excise tax shall be separately identified on 15 each ratepayer's bill ((as "Telecommunications devices funds for deaf and hearing impaired")). All proceeds from the TDD excise tax shall be 16 17 put into a fund to be administered by the office through the department. 18 19 (((+6))) (8) The office shall administer and control the award of 20 money to all parties incurring costs in implementing and maintaining telecommunications services, programs, equipment, and technical support 21 services in accordance with the provisions of RCW 43.20A.725. 22 23 $((\frac{7}{1}))$ (9) The department shall provide the legislature with a 24 biennial report on the operation of the program. The first report shall be provided no later than December 1, 1990, and successive 25 reports every two years thereafter. Reports shall be prepared in 26 consultation with the TDD advisory committee and the utilities and 27 28 transportation commission. The reports shall, at a minimum, briefly 29 outline the accomplishments of the program, the number of persons served, revenues and expenditures, the prioritizing of services to 30

- 1 those eligible based on such factors as degree of physical handicap or
- 2 the allocation of the program's revenue between provision of devices to
- 3 individuals and operation of the state-wide relay service, other major
- 4 policy or operational issues, and proposals for improvements or changes
- 5 for the program. The first report shall contain a study which includes
- 6 examination of like programs in other states, alternative methods of
- 7 financing the program, alternative methods of using the
- 8 telecommunications system, advantages and disadvantages of operating
- 9 the TDD program from within the department, by telecommunications
- 10 companies, and by a private, nonprofit corporation, and means to limit
- 11 demand for system usage.
- 12 (((8))) (10) The program shall be consistent with the requirements
- 13 of federal law for the operation of both interstate and intrastate
- 14 telecommunications services for the deaf or hearing impaired or speech
- 15 impaired. The department and the utilities and transportation
- 16 commission shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with federal
- 17 requirements and shall provide timely notice to the legislature of any
- 18 legislation that may be required to accomplish compliance.
- 19 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.20A.730 and 1990 c 89 s 4 are each amended to read
- 20 as follows:
- 21 (1) The department advisory committee on deafness shall establish
- 22 a TDD advisory committee to oversee operation of the TDD program. The
- 23 TDD advisory committee shall consist of no more than thirteen
- 24 individuals representing the hearing impaired and speech impaired
- 25 communities, the department, the utilities and transportation
- 26 commission, agencies and services serving the hearing impaired and
- 27 speech impaired, and local exchange companies in the state. The
- 28 membership on the TDD advisory committee shall, to the maximum extent
- 29 possible, include representatives from (a) the major state-wide

- 1 organizations representing the hearing impaired and speech impaired,
- 2 (b) organizations for the hearing impaired and speech impaired located
- 3 in areas of the state with high populations of such persons, and (c)
- 4 organizations that reflect the different geographic regions of the
- 5 state. In order to develop, implement, and maintain a state-wide relay
- 6 system providing cost-effective relay centers at a reasonable cost and
- 7 that will meet the requirements of the hearing impaired and speech
- 8 impaired, the TDD advisory committee shall investigate options, conduct
- 9 public hearings as needed to ((determine)) develop recommendations on
- 10 the most cost-effective method of operating a state-wide relay system
- 11 providing relay centers to the hearing impaired and speech impaired,
- 12 and solicit the advice, counsel, and assistance of interested parties
- 13 and nonprofit consumer organizations for hearing impaired and speech
- 14 impaired persons state-wide. The TDD advisory committee shall also, in
- 15 conjunction with the department, monitor the activities and moneys that
- 16 are being spent by the department for the program herein.
- 17 (2) The TDD advisory committee shall provide reports at least four
- 18 times per year to the administrators and operators of the TDD state-
- 19 wide relay service. The committee shall report on the extent to which
- 20 the relay system is meeting the needs of disabled citizens in the
- 21 state, and shall include program elements that are successful, program
- 22 <u>elements in need of improvement, and any recommendations from the</u>
- 23 <u>committee</u>.
- 24 (3) The TDD advisory committee shall establish criteria and specify
- 25 state-wide organizations representing the hearing or speech impaired
- 26 meeting such criteria that are to receive telecommunications devices
- 27 pursuant to RCW 43.20A.725(1), and in which offices the equipment shall
- 28 be installed if an organization has more than one office.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 80.36 RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 Each telecommunications company providing intrastate interexchange
- 4 voice transmission service shall offer discounts from otherwise
- 5 applicable long distance rates for service used in conjunction with the
- 6 state-wide relay service authorized under RCW 43.20A.725. Such long
- 7 distance discounts shall be determined in relation to the additional
- 8 time required to translate calls through relay operators. In the case
- 9 of intrastate long distance services provided pursuant to tariff, the
- 10 commission shall require the incorporation of such discounts.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** If any provision of this act or its
- 12 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 13 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 14 persons or circumstances is not affected.
