- AN ACT Relating to outdoor burning; and amending RCW 70.94.743.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.94.743 and 1991 c 199 s 402 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) Consistent with the policy of the state to reduce outdoor
- 6 burning to the greatest extent ((practical)) that will significantly
- 7 <u>improve air quality</u>:
- 8 (a) Except for subsection (3) of this section, outdoor burning
- 9 shall not be allowed in any area of the state where federal or state
- 10 ambient air quality standards ((are exceeded for pollutants emitted by
- 11 outdoor)) for particulates were violated for more than one day during
- 12 the preceding twelve months. A day in which the standards were
- 13 exceeded due to sources other than outdoor burning shall not be counted
- 14 as a violation for the purpose of prohibiting burning.

- 1 (b) Outdoor burning shall ((not be allowed)) be limited in location
- 2 through regulation by the local government in any urban growth area as
- 3 defined by RCW 36.70A.030, or any city of the state having a population
- 4 greater than ((ten)) twenty thousand people if such cities are
- 5 threatened to exceed state or federal air quality standards, and where
- 6 alternative disposal practices consistent with good solid waste
- 7 management ((are reasonably available)) or practices eliminating
- 8 production of organic refuse are ((reasonably)) available at reasonable
- 9 cost.
- 10 Prior to the establishment of urban growth areas, outdoor burning
- 11 may be limited within boundaries established by local air pollution
- 12 control authorities in areas documented to have violated federal or
- 13 state ambient air quality standards for particulates for more than one
- 14 day during the preceding twelve months, if the primary source of the
- 15 <u>violation is outdoor burning</u>. ((<del>In no event shall such burning be</del>
- 16 allowed after December 31, 2000.))
- 17 (2) "Outdoor burning" means the combustion of material of any type
- 18 in an open fire or in an outdoor container without providing for the
- 19 control of combustion or the control of emissions from the combustion.
- 20 (3) This section shall not apply to: (a) Silvicultural burning
- 21 used to improve or maintain fire dependent ecosystems for rare plants
- 22 or animals within state, federal, and private natural area preserves,
- 23 natural resource conservation areas, parks, and other wildlife areas or
- 24 (b) if a burn permit is issued by a local fire district, the burning of
- 25 weeds, trees and branches felled by a windstorm that is confirmed by an
- 26 official weather station, agricultural residue if approved by a local
- 27 soil conservation district, or diseased or pest-infested plant
- 28 <u>material</u>.
