- 1 AN ACT Relating to appropriations for salaries of state employees,
- 2 teachers, and state elected officials; amending RCW 43.03.011,

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** From the 1991-93 biennial appropriations
- 6 made to the affected state agencies, the director of financial
- 7 management shall place in reserve status that portion of each agency's
- 8 appropriation that reflects the state elected officials' salary
- 9 increase under RCW 43.03.011(3), 43.03.012(3), and 43.03.013(3). If
- 10 the conditions required under RCW 43.03.011(3), 43.03.012(3), and
- 11 43.03.013(3) for implementation of the salary increases are not met by
- 12 June 30, 1993, the amounts placed in reserve shall be transmitted to
- 13 the state treasurer for immediate deposit in the budget stabilization
- 14 account under RCW 43.88.525.
