## SUBSTITUTE SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8402

By Senate Committee on Education (originally sponsored by Senators Murray, Bailey, Rinehart, A. Smith and Pelz).

Read first time March 5, 1991.

- 1 WHEREAS, The quality of education is improved when educational
- 2 employees and educational support staff are able to work and live in
- 3 the same community; and
- 4 WHEREAS, In many areas of the state affordable housing is becoming
- 5 an increasingly scarce commodity; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The average cost of purchasing a house in large
- 7 metropolitan areas of this state is in excess of one hundred sixty-five
- 8 thousand dollars with monthly payments for mortgage, taxes, and
- 9 insurance of almost sixteen hundred dollars a month; and
- 10 WHEREAS, A person would need an annual income of at least fifty-
- 11 three thousand dollars to qualify for a loan on a house; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The highest paid teacher in the state only makes forty-two
- 13 thousand dollars a year and that teacher is required to have a PhD and
- 14 fifteen or more years' experience and a beginning teacher earns between
- 15 twenty thousand dollars with a BA and twenty-three thousand nine

- 1 hundred eighty dollars with an MA and classified employees make
- 2 substantially less; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Many educational employees cannot afford to live in the
- 4 areas in which they work making it more difficult for those educational
- 5 employees to maintain vital links with the school community including
- 6 participation in after school activities; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Housing assistance programs for educational employees
- 8 would help school districts and the state recruit and retain qualified
- 9 educational employees and improve the quality of education by enabling
- 10 those employees to live in the same communities as do the students; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Programs are being designed around the country to help
- 12 employees obtain affordable housing including group mortgage
- 13 origination, closing cost subsidies, mortgage guarantees, group
- 14 mortgage insurance, down payment loans, mortgage buydown programs, and
- 15 the purchase of mortgagebacked securities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Both private entities and the housing finance commission
- 17 exist in the state of Washington that are able to establish housing
- 18 assistance programs for educational employees;
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the State of
- 20 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the
- 21 establishment of housing assistance programs for certificated and
- 22 classified educational employees be encouraged and that the housing
- 23 finance commission and private entities be encouraged to establish
- 24 those programs; and
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature recognizes that
- 26 encouraging the provision of housing assistance to educational
- 27 employees in the state of Washington will be an important inducement
- 28 towards creating and maintaining excellent educational employees and
- 29 thus a high quality education system in the state of Washington; and

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate transmit
- 2 copies of this resolution to the Housing Finance Commission, the
- 3 Department of Community Development, Housing Division, to distribute to
- 4 interested parties throughout the state of Washington, to the
- 5 Washington State School Directors Association to make available to
- 6 school boards across the state, to the Washington Education
- 7 Association, other labor organizations, and to the Superintendent of
- 8 Public Instruction.
