## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8417

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 1st Special Session

Read first time June 26, 1991.

- 1 WHEREAS, It is in the best interests of the citizens of the State
- 2 of Washington to have the State actively involved in policy decisions
- 3 regarding the lands adjacent to the Lake Roosevelt National Recreation
- 4 Area; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area has attracted
- 6 many thousands of in-state and out-of-state tourists and
- 7 recreationists; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The adjoining counties have assumed increased
- 9 responsibilities and expenditures in providing law enforcement, fire
- 10 protection, roads and highways, garbage collection, pollution
- 11 abatement, and emergency response; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The adjoining homeowners and property owners have no
- 13 governmental entity to plead their grievances; and
- 14 WHEREAS, It is necessary to provide full consideration to all
- 15 parties affected by policy decisions regarding federal lands adjoining
- 16 Lake Roosevelt;

- 1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
- 2 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That a joint
- 3 select committee on Lake Roosevelt be established to study the
- 4 relationship between the State of Washington, the United States Bureau
- 5 of Reclamation, the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs, the
- 6 National Park Service, and the Spokane and Colville Indian Nations in
- 7 regard to policymaking for the Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area
- 8 and adjoining properties. The committee shall determine a method by
- 9 which the State of Washington may be a full partner in the long-range
- 10 planning and policy decisions affecting the Lake Roosevelt National
- 11 Recreation Area and the adjoining properties; and
- 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of eight
- 13 members, four of whom shall be members of the senate representing
- 14 equally the majority and minority, appointed by the president of the
- 15 senate; four of whom shall be members of the house of representatives
- 16 representing equally the majority and minority, appointed by the
- 17 speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
- 19 recommendations to the Legislature at the regular session held in 1992.
