- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE INTERNAL REVENUE
- 5 SERVICE:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, It is critical that the federal government provide
- 10 leadership to the states in order to ensure that health care delivery
- 11 reform strategies are compatible and consistent throughout the nation;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, It is critical that every individual in the United States
- 14 be covered by a basic health care policy and insured for catastrophic
- 15 care; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Many citizens cannot afford basic health care coverage;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, The tax structure does not encourage acquisition of health
- 4 care coverage through insurance or direct purchase of necessary medical
- 5 care; and
- 6 WHEREAS, These laws provide tax relief only to those who purchase
- 7 their medical care through a health insurance policy provided by their
- 8 employer; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Many individuals currently receive health care coverage
- 10 through their employer, however the coverage is not transferable should
- 11 they change jobs or become unemployed; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Many unemployed or underemployed citizens cannot provide
- 13 adequate health care coverage for themselves or their families; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Consumers with very low incomes or very high medical costs
- 15 should receive extra tax relief; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The consumer of health care and the health care
- 17 professional together can best make informed medical decisions, based
- 18 on personal needs in a consumer-based program;
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress
- 20 provide tax relief for medical care and health insurance to employees
- 21 and families directly instead of through the workplace; and that
- 22 Congress authorize a national health care consumer-based mechanism
- 23 that:
- 24 (1) Repeals tax exemptions currently available to businesses that
- 25 provide health care insurance;
- 26 (2) Allocates money back to consumers so that they can shop for
- 27 their health coverage;
- 28 (3) Institutes tax deductions for individuals who purchase their
- 29 own health care insurance and pay for health care from their preferred

- 1 provider and on purchase of prescription and over-the-counter
- 2 medications;
- 3 (4) Allows tax deductions on personal income tax for medical
- 4 insurance and prescribed medications;
- 5 (5) Provides higher tax credits to those very low-income or high
- 6 medical users so that they too can shop for their basic health care;
- 7 and
- 8 (6) Requires all heads of households to purchase at least a basic
- 9 level of catastrophic insurance for themselves and their families.
- 10 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 11 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 12 States, the Internal Revenue Service, the President of the United
- 13 States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each
- 14 member of Congress from the State of Washington.
