- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The Endangered Species Act is before the Congress for
- 9 reauthorization in 1992; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This Memorial is designed, especially in its initial
- 11 phases, to emphasize exclusively the biological needs of threatened or
- 12 endangered species; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The lack of consideration given to the social consequences
- 14 of meeting these biological needs leads to policies that focus too
- 15 greatly on the animal or plant under review, and not on the humans who
- 16 are asked to sacrifice on behalf of that plant or animal; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Northern Spotted Owl and the Columbia River Sockeye
- 2 Salmon are both in the process of receiving special protection under
- 3 the Endangered Species Act, decisions that have already had far
- 4 reaching consequences over much of the State of Washington; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The experience in Washington state with the Northern
- 6 Spotted Owl has been a public policy disaster, leading to the
- 7 unemployment of tens of thousands of people whose livelihoods and
- 8 dreams were given far less consideration than was the bird being
- 9 protected, leading in some cases to the economic devastation of entire
- 10 communities; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Many rightly fear that those who fish, those who farm,
- 12 those who own property, and those who rely on electricity are all
- 13 similarly threatened with disaster by the Columbia River Sockeye Salmon
- 14 listing now under way; and
- WHEREAS, It is distinctly unfair for federal policymakers to set a
- 16 national goal to save species and then ask that only certain people
- 17 bear the price of that goal through their loss of employment and their
- 18 private property;
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that during
- 20 consideration of reauthorization of the Endangered Species Act, the
- 21 Congress and the President work to modify that Act so as to:
- 22 (1) Ensure that humans are given at least equal consideration to
- 23 the development of plans to save listed species;
- 24 (2) Require a separate, true, and complete accounting of the total
- 25 human, social, and economic costs of saving each listed plant or
- 26 animal, to be completed by an agency of the federal government apart
- 27 from that charged with protecting the species, and prepared in close
- 28 cooperation with state and local governments located in the affected
- 29 area; and

- 1 (3) Ensure that the entire nation bear the costs of saving a
- 2 species deemed worthy of special protection, not just those persons or
- 3 state and local governments who exist nearby.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 5 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 6 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 7 House of Representatives, and to each member of Congress from the State
- 8 of Washington.
