- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Rising unemployment places greater burdens on individuals
- 9 and families in Washington State; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Changes in the structure of the Washington economy mean
- 11 more workers will face the prospect of long-term unemployment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Workers will face more frequent career changes which
- 13 require new skills and education; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Washington's citizens are deserving of the highest quality
- 15 unemployment, employment, and training services; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Washington State Employment Security Department is
- 2 facing a funding crisis; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Federal funding for employment services has fallen in real
- 4 terms during nine of the last eleven years; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Funds are no longer allocated to cover increases in the
- 6 costs due to inflation; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Increased costs due to changes in state law are no longer
- 8 funded; and
- 9 WHEREAS, These shortfalls exist in spite of the fact that funds
- 10 held at the federal level exceed amounts required by the states to
- 11 provide quality services; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Washington State employers provide funding for programs
- 13 for the unemployed through payment of the Federal Unemployment Tax; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Revenue from the Federal Unemployment Tax can only be
- 15 expended for the administration of Employment Security programs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Each year one billion dollars more is collected at the
- 17 federal level than is allocated to the states for program services; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Funds to administer Employment Security activities are
- 19 held hostage at the federal level in an effort to mask the federal
- 20 budget deficit;
- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress
- 22 release tax moneys paid by Washington State employers to support
- 23 Employment Security programs.
- 24 BE IT RESOLVED, That Employment Security programs be funded at a
- 25 level that will guarantee for Washington citizens ready access to
- 26 quality programs to assist them in their return to stable employment
- 27 and provide partial replacement of lost wages while unemployed; and
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 29 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 30 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
