- 1 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 2 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 3 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE PRESIDING OFFICER OF
- 4 EACH HOUSE OF EACH STATE LEGISLATURE IN THE UNITED STATES:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Despite various efforts to control the growth of federal
- 9 spending, the President has had insufficient authority with respect to
- 10 the budgetary process; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The federal budget has not been balanced since 1969, and
- 12 the national debt jeopardizes the economic well-being of the country;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Presidents from both major political parties have cited
- 15 the need for greater presidential involvement in administering the
- 16 budgetary affairs of the nation; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Governors in forty-three states have the constitutional
- 2 power to veto items of appropriation while approving other portions of
- 3 a bill; and
- 4 WHEREAS, This power has been described by political scholars as a
- 5 highly desirable one, and one that has had a positive effect on the
- 6 operation of government; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Under Article V of the United States Constitution,
- 8 amendments to the Constitution may be proposed by the Congress whenever
- 9 two-thirds of both houses deem it necessary, or, on the application of
- 10 the legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, the Congress
- 11 shall call a Constitutional Convention for the purpose of proposing
- 12 amendments;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists, a majority of all members of the
- 14 two houses, voting separately concurring herein, petition the Congress
- 15 of the United States of America to adopt an amendment to the
- 16 Constitution of the United States, for submission to the states for
- 17 ratification, authorizing the President of the United States to reduce
- 18 or eliminate, in whole or in part, one or more items of appropriation
- 19 while approving other portions of a bill.
- 20 BE IT RESOLVED, That the Legislature of the state of Washington
- 21 hereby requests the Congress to submit to the several states the
- 22 amendment to the Constitution of the United States for purposes of
- 23 ratification; and
- 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 25 transmitted to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker
- 26 of the House of Representatives, and to the Senate and House of
- 27 Representatives of the United States, in Congress assembled, and to the
- 28 presiding officer of each house of each state legislature in the United
- 29 States.
