SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 8031

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The state of Washington has a strong tradition of
- 9 environmental concern and a commitment to sound planning and management
- 10 of our coastal area as evidenced by the passage by its citizens of the
- 11 Shoreline Management Act in 1971; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The state's Coastal Zone Management program was the first
- 13 in the nation to be approved by the United States Department of
- 14 Commerce as a further commitment to the partnership of local, state,
- 15 and federal governments in managing our coastal areas; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The 1982 Coastal Barrier Resources Act prohibits federal
- 2 expenditures on designated undeveloped low-lying shoreline features
- 3 such as sand spits and beaches that protect a bay, lagoon, or marsh
- 4 from the open ocean. The Act originally applied to the Atlantic and
- 5 Gulf coasts for the purposes of:
- 6 (1) Reducing losses of lives and property due to storms and
- 7 flooding;
- 8 (2) Protecting the natural environment; and
- 9 (3) Reducing wasteful federal expenditures; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Act was amended by Congress in 1990 to include Pacific
- 11 coast sites, including Washington state; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Department of the Interior, through the United States
- 13 Fish and Wildlife Service, now has identified one hundred three
- 14 potential sites on Washington's ocean coast and in Puget Sound for
- 15 inclusion in the program; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Senate and the House of Representatives of the state
- 17 of Washington oppose the inclusion of these sites for the following
- 18 reasons:
- 19 (1) The conditions that exist on the Atlantic and Gulf coasts do
- 20 not exist here;
- 21 (2) The sites are poorly identified and in many cases are too small
- 22 or already developed;
- 23 (3) There has been little opportunity for public education, comment
- 24 or review on the proposed sites;
- 25 (4) Many of the proposed sites are already protected as state parks
- 26 and wildlife refuges;
- 27 (5) The state Shorelines Management Act provides protection and
- 28 wise use of these areas under an effective local and state program;

- 1 (6) Major financial impacts will occur on those projects already
- 2 planned but not yet developed and where removal of federal funds would
- 3 make them uneconomical;
- 4 (7) There has been little consultation with Indian tribes or
- 5 nations and local and state officials in identifying the potential
- 6 sites; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress
- 8 neither accept recommendations from the Department of the Interior for
- 9 sites in this state nor enact legislation to bring them into the
- 10 Coastal Barriers Resources System.
- 11 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 12 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 13 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 14 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 15 Washington.
